Public to View**Papers of FDR****7 Types to Be Kept Secret**

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26 (UPI) — About 88 per cent of the 4 million to 5 million personal papers of the late President Franklin D. Roosevelt will be opened to scholars and historians Mar. 17 next year.

Director of Archives Wayne C. Groves announced today that all but the papers which might hurt national security or reflect on the character of living persons or their families will be opened to the public as of that date.

The Roosevelt papers, contained in the Franklin D. Roosevelt Library, Hyde Park, N. Y., are being segregated by Grace Tully, the late President's secretary, and Samuel Rosenman, FDR's adviser.

Segregated by Types

Miss Tully and Mr. Rosenman set out seven types of papers which will not be opened next March, and perhaps not for 25 years. These seven categories are:

ONE. Investigative reports on persons.

TWO. Applications and recommendations for positions.

THREE. Derogatory remarks concerning the character, loyalty, integrity, or ability of individuals.

FOUR. Information concerning personal or family affairs of individuals.

FIVE. Information of a type that could be used in the harassment of living persons or the relatives of recently deceased persons.

SIX. Information the release of which would be prejudicial to national security.

SEVEN. Information the release of which would be prejudicial to the maintenance of friendly relations with foreign nations.

Bilingual Dogs Are Hobby of Student**Pets Obey in English, Spanish**

A SHORTRIDGE High School senior is teaching her three dogs to "speak" Spanish to the envy of her teen-age friends.

Sixteen-year-old Martha Wise's pets don't actually bark in the Latin language, but they do obey Spanish-spoken commands.

"Cricket," her tiny black Manchester, jumps through a hoop when she says "Salta." And at the command of "Habla," her German Shepherd, "Fuzzy," utters a series of sharp barks.

The bilingual pets keep Martha in demand for school entertainment. With them she has appeared in the Junior Vaudeville and the Summer Frolic.

FOR THE Christmas season Martha has a special routine. She tricks up "Feney," another German Shepherd, as Santa Claus, while "Fuzzy" pulls "Cricket" in a sleigh.

With this act Martha will be featured at a Job's Daughters program next month.

Two years ago Martha began taking Spanish as her high school language. Why not let her pets "study" the language along with her, she thought with typical teenage ingenuity.

"So," says Martha, "as I learned I taught them. They picked it up pretty fast, too."

SO FAR she has taught them six commands—"sientate" (sit), "abajo" (down), "quedate" (stay), "ven tu" (come), "salta" (jump) and "habla" (speak).

She rewards them for a good performance with "bueno perro" (good dog).

Her method of teaching is very

simple, says Martha. She speaks the Spanish word, and uses the same signals for Spanish as for English.

ALTHOUGH she claims no favorite among her three pets, Martha admits that "Fuzzy" knows the most Spanish. But after all, the 4-year-old dog is oldest of the three.

The title, "tambi," means "brother." Brother Selvaretnam has taken the monk's vow of poverty, chastity and obedience.

Dr. Crain met the Ceylon citizen in Switzerland while on a six-month tour of Europe this year. Dr. Crain is secretary of the Department of Social Welfare of the United Christian Missionary Society.

He says Brother Selvaretnam and other members of his order operate an ashram for boys. He was educated for the Congregational-Christian ministry but went with his denomination when it merged with the United Church of South India.

Dr. and Mrs. Cleo Blackburn will entertain the visitor as their house guest upon arrival and Dr. and Mrs. Crain the rest of the week-end. He speaks English with great facility and gives a talk well interspersed with humor, Dr. Crain reports.
