

Rev. John Craine Named to Post

Church to Honor
Pastor at Luncheon

The vestry and wardens of Christ Episcopal Church will give a luncheon in honor of the new rector of the church on the Circle Friday noon.

The Rev. John P. Craine of Seattle, Wash., the new rector, will spend three days here this week and take charge of the parish in May. Arthur D. Pratt and Eli Lilly, senior and junior wardens of the church, made the announcement of the appointment of the minister today. The Episcopal clergy of the city have been invited to the luncheon.

The Rev. Mr. Craine now fills the post of rector of Trinity Parish Church in Seattle. He was born in Cleveland, was graduated from Kenyon College and holds a BD degree from Bexley College. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa. The new rector is 39, married, the father of one child and has been a priest of the church since 1936.

He served as student minister at St. Mark's Church, Cleveland, and also has been curate at Trinity Church, Santa Barbara, Calif.; rector of Trinity Church, Oakland, Calif.; and canon of the Cathedral in San Francisco. In 1944, he accepted the position of editor of the Pacific Churchman, a diocesan publication.

Christ Church has been without a rector since the death of Dr. E. Ainger Powell in the summer of 1948. The Rev. John B. Love, curate, has acted as spiritual leader of the parish since that time.

Indiana Political Handbook Issued

Offers Analysis of
State Characteristics

The State Chamber of Commerce today announced publication for the first time of the facts of Indiana political life.

The new publication, scheduled for statewide distribution, is called the "Citizenship Participation Handbook." It offers a facts-and-figures analysis of Indiana's political characteristics.

The 300-page looseleaf book also tells the story of several of the major governmental issues around which much of the coming election campaign will be fought.

A Workbook for All
Clarence A. Jackson, executive vice president of the Chamber of Commerce, described the handbook as a "workbook for all Hoosiers interested in working to elect to public office qualified men and women responsible to no pressure group."

"Purpose of the book," Mr. Jackson said, "is to deal with political facts and public issues and to encourage participation in government—let the political chips fall where they may."

High in the list of the political facts of life contained in the new publication is the fact that only one Hoosier in three eligible to vote participates in primary elections. Only about two-thirds of the eligible voters participate in general elections.

Other findings reported in the non-partisan analysis are:
ONE: That the independent voters decide most Indiana elections.
TWO: That more voters stayed

at home in 1948 than voted for the winning candidate in any state contest except the governor race.

THREE: Hoosier voters will cross party lines against even a strong trend to elect especially popular or qualified candidates.

FOUR: Public officials, once elected, are more often guided by background and personal conviction than by party platforms or policies.

FIVE: Most political races in Indiana are decided by relatively few votes, one way or the other.

Special state issues treated in the book, which will sell at \$4 a volume, include labor-management relations, social security and taxes.
