

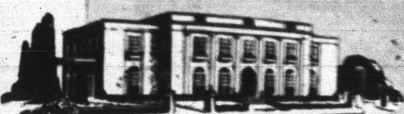

## Raphael Madonna Sells At 'Cut Rate' \$27,500

NEW YORK, Mar. 3 (UP)—A 445-year-old painting of the Madonna by Raphael sold for \$27,500 last night and art dealers today blamed "the increasing popularity of modern art" for its cut rate price.

The famed "Peruzzi Madonna" was sold at the Parke-Bernet Auction Galleries with a collection of Frans Hals, Rubens, Van Dyck, Gainsboroughs and Turners. None of the pictures brought even half the price it was worth 30 years ago, auction officials said.

"I can remember when a Raphael brought six figures at a sale in Europe," said an elderly art dealer attending the sale.

## Moving from Your House

Because of the Coal Shortage?

Some Helpful Hints to  
PREVENT YOUR PLUMBING  
from FREEZING

- Drain the plumbing. This usually can be done by turning off the water at the stop-and-waste valve located near the meter.
- Drain the hot water tank at the valve at the bottom of the tank (and be sure to turn off the electricity or gas).
- Put about one pint of anti-freeze solution in the trap under such fixtures as the lavatory, sink, wash basin.
- Wrap the water meter and pipes between the meter and the wall with old clothing, carpeting, or with several layers of crumpled newspapers.
- If you have any doubts about precautions, call your plumber.
- If you plan to be gone for a time—longer than a week—it would be wise to call our Service Department, Lincoln 7591, and have the water service completely turned off and the water meter removed. This will drain the plumbing, of course.
