Health Bill Seen As 'Confusing'

Because supporters of the pending national health insurance proposal, SB 1637, insist it doesn't create a system of socialized medicine and opponents of the measure insist it does, the public is highly confused and caught in the middle of a word battle.

This opinion was advanced by Wray E. Fleming today at a luncheon meeting sponsored by the Woman's Auxiliary to the Indianapolis Medical Society in the Columbia Club.

"The pending proposal confers authority upon the government to control through rules and regulations. In that respect it is socialistic," he said.

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
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Music Group To Meet
