4 Killed in Crash Of Car and Truck

BEDFORD, Mar. 22 — A Seymour farmer, his 10-year-old daughter, and two Mitchell men are dead today and three other members of the farmer's family were in a Bedford hospital as the result of a head-on car-truck crash.

The two vehicles crashed last night on Rd. 27, one mile north of Bedford, when the truck got on the wrong side of the highway, according to state police.

The dead: Emery Hall, 49, and his daughter, Janet, 10, of Seymour, and Romaine Cottengain, 36, and Walter Tolbert, 47, of Mitchell.

Mrs. Millicent Hall, 39, and two daughters, Vivian, 16, and Joyce, 10, twin of the dead girl, were all injured. The mother and 10-year-old child were reported in a critical condition at Dunn Memorial Hospital.

Were En Route Home

State police said the Hall family had been to Oolite where Mr. Hall purchased two automobile tires and were en route home when the accident occurred. Vivien Hall, only conscious member of the family, told investigating officers she couldn't remember what happened.

Police said track marks on the highway and the condition of the wreckage indicated that the pick-up truck driven by Mr. Cottengain was on the left side of the center line when the crash occurred. Mr. Tolbert was a passenger in the truck.

Janet Hall died shortly after admittance to the hospital. The three others were pronounced dead at the scene of the accident.

FRANKLIN, Mar. 22 — The Citizens Committee for Improvement of Franklin Schools will stand by its guns despite investigation of the Franklin school system by two agencies of education.

At a meeting of the committee and the Franklin School Board last night, Russell Yount, board president, said the probe will be made by the Indiana University School of Education and the North Central Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges.

Committeemen presented the board with an eight-point demand which sought application of restrictions on the progressive teaching system used here. The program was adopted last week during a meeting in the City building.

Dwight L. Smith, chairman of the citizens committee, said his organization will retain its position regardless of the outcome of the investigation.

Requests Answer

"We have submitted our proposals," Mr. Smith said. "We expect replies to the points and explanations as to what will be done to make corrections."

In the proposal, the committee is seeking more emphasis on pupil discipline and basic subject matter. The organization warned the board against any attempts to "whitewash" the situation through investigation, although "honest inquiry" was welcomed.

Committeemen declared that classroom drill on basic subjects has increased in tempo since the probe was indicated and the citizens committee organized. School officials contended, however, that drills are the usual ones given in March for test preparation.




