## John Rovick Rites Set at Muncie

**Bird Dog Group Past President Dies**

MUNCIE, Mar. 31.—Rites for John D. (Jack) Rovick, past president of the Indiana Field Trial Association, will be held here at 3 p. m. tomorrow in the Meeks Mortuary. Burial will be in Elm Ridge Cemetery.



Mr. Rovick, whose home was in Salem, was stricken Wednesday while attending the Indiana Field Trials in the Versailles State Park and died yesterday in Courthouse Inn, Versailles. He was 57.

A bird dog hobbyist and a leading figure in the Delaware County Conservation Society he was serving as all-events chairman at the trials. Meet officials canceled remaining events on the program following his death.

Born in Detroit, Mich., Mr. Rovick lived many years in Muncie before moving to Selma three years ago. He had been a manufacturers' agent for the past 15 years.

**Retired Last Year**  
President of the Indiana Field Trial Association for three years before his retirement last year, he was also a former president of the Fourth Regional Field Trials Association. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge, Elks Lodge and a past president of the Delaware County Country Club.

Surviving are his wife, Reva; a son, John D. Jr., North Hollywood, Cal.; a daughter, Mrs. Paul Shryer, Beulah, Mich.; a sister, Mrs. Helen Rothenberger, Boyne City, Mich., and his stepmother, Mrs. Maude Rovick, Boyne City.

## Burroughs' Estate Set 'Over \$10,000'

LOS ANGELES, Mar. 31 (UP)—Author Edgar Rice Burroughs left an estate "in excess of \$10,000," a will filed for probate revealed today.

The creator of Tarzan died Mar. 19. He was 74.

Mr. Burroughs made a fortune from his fictional apeman, but the actual value of his estate was not disclosed.

The Socialist leader died yesterday at the age of 77. Funeral services probably will be held Sunday with government leaders attending. He is reported to have asked that he be buried at Jouy en Josas.
