## FBI Given 'Data' On Lattimore

### Accused by McCarthy As Soviet Agent

WASHINGTON, Mar. 31 (UP)—Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy has handed the FBI documents he says will prove Far Eastern expert Owen Lattimore a Communist and a Soviet agent, his office revealed today.

The Wisconsin Republican was in a local hospital for sinus treatment and no details were available on where, when or how the material was given the government's top investigative agency. The FBI was silent too.

The data bearing on the "Lattimore case" was described in part by Sen. McCarthy in a Senate speech yesterday. Sen. McCarthy said it links Mr. Lattimore to a 1945 espionage case, showed that the Johns Hopkins University professor was a source of information for Soviet intelligence and gave the name of a witness ready to testify that Mr. Lattimore was a Communist Party member.

Mr. Lattimore, directly and through his wife, has described Sen. McCarthy's charges "pure hogwash." He is en route here from a United Nations mission in Afghanistan to testify Tuesday before a Senate Foreign Relations Investigating Committee.

## Brownson Files In Congress Race

### Two GOP Opponents Already in Field

Charles B. Brownson, Eleventh District American Legion commander, filed officially today as a candidate for Republican congressional nomination.

Mr. Brownson has been endorsed by the "Committee to Elect a Republican Congressman."

His entry set up a three-way GOP race in which he will be opposed for the nomination by Miss Sally Butler, and the Rev. John W. Douglas.

Prospect of another important Republican entry dimmed when Mrs. Fern E. Norris filed as a candidate for the Indiana House of Representatives.

Mrs. Norris, former reporter of the Supreme and Appellate courts, had been expected in some party quarters to enter the congressional race.

On the Democratic side of the legislative picture, Mrs. Sarah Beasley became a candidate for nomination as a state representative.

## Cline Named Trustee Of Indiana Foundation

Frederick B. Cline was appointed today by Mayor Wene as a trustee of the Indiana Foundation.

Mr. Cline, president of the Frederick B. Cline Real Estate Co., will fill the unexpired term of Thomas Sheerin, who died recently. The term will expire Jan. 5, 1953.

## Brickmasons Schedule Apprentice Contest

Officers of the Indiana Brickmasons' Apprentice Association have approved preliminary plans for the third annual Indiana Brickmasons' Apprentice Contest. Twenty-four contestants will be chosen in district elimination contests and will compete in finals at the Indiana State Fair.

The Indiana Brick Producers Association and the Indiana State Masonry Conference are co-operating in the contest.

## Carl G. Lutz Files For Jacobs' Seat

### Marine Officer Enters Democratic Primary

WASHINGTON, Mar. 31—Rep. Andrew Jacobs, Indianapolis Democrat, today has a primary opponent.

First Lt. Carl G. Lutz of the U. S. Marine Corps headquarters here announced that he has filed for the Jacobs seat with Secretary of State Charles Fleming.

He declined to outline the nature of his campaign in regard to issues on the grounds that he is forbidden to do so by the rules of the Marine Corps service.

This will be the second try of Lt. Lutz for the 11th District Congressional nomination on the Democratic ticket. He was one of a field of four in 1948 when Mr. Jacobs won. "He came in second."

The candidate is 38 and a graduate of Shortridge High School, Butler University and National University Law School of Washington, D. C.

He was on the Capitol staff of former Rep. Louis Ludlow, Indianapolis Democrat, from 1933 until 1943, when he enlisted as a Marine Corps private and served throughout the war rising to officer rank.

When he ran for the congressional nomination two years ago he was practicing law here. Later he returned to active duty as a Marine Corps reserve officer in the legal division of corps headquarters, where he now is stationed.

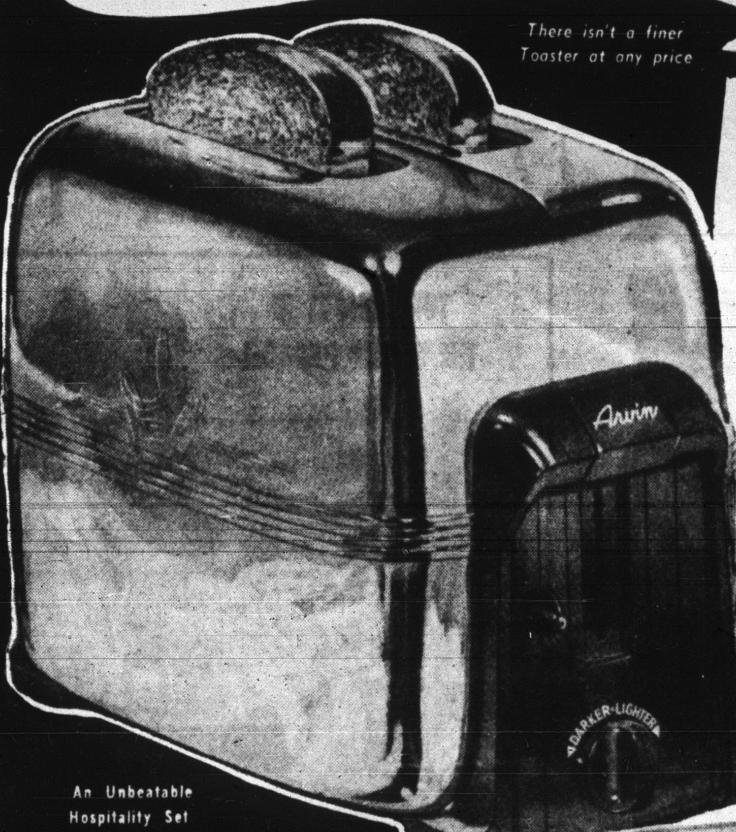
