**Geiger Counter  
 Spots Tumors**

 ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., June 13—An atomic age technique for locating brain tumors is 95 per cent accurate, Dr. John Martin of Northwestern University Medical School reported to the American Neurological Association meeting here today.

Using this technique, the surgeon injects radioactive tracer dye into the patient's blood stream. Then a Geiger counter device shaped somewhat like a skull cap is attached to the patient's head and moved over it to 32 different positions. Since the radioactive dye concentrates in the tumor tissue, the counter shows up the location.

The method was also 95 per cent accurate, Dr. Martin reported, in determining the absence of tumors. His findings were made on 200 patients examined at Northwestern Medical School and the VA hospital at Hines, Ill.

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
