Poet Keeps 'Status Quo' In Marriage Mixup

Louis Untermeyer Declared Legally Wed To Wife No. 1 and No. 3, Sticks With No. 5

Louis Untermeyer, New York poet, declared still legally wed to wife No. 1 and 3, maintained a "status quo" today with wife No. 5 whom he married in 1948.

In a ruling written strictly in prose a Supreme Court jurist ruled Mr. Untermeyer, 65, is still married to Jean Starr whom he married in 1907, divorced, remarried as wife No. 3, and divorced again.

The court ruled on a suit brought by Mrs. Untermeyer No. 5, Ester Antin,

who sued to oust Mrs. Untermeyer No. 3, Byrna Ivens, and have herself declared his legal spouse.

Court said Mexican divorces shedding Miss Starr were null and void and Miss Antin had no claim as his

wife. Ruling Mr. Untermeyer didn't mention status of present Mrs. Untermeyer or the former Virginia Moore, who did stint as wife No. 2.

Postponement of School Board action to retire over-age teachers in Indianapolis public school system was confirmed today by Board President J. Dwight Peterson.

"We have offered one-semester contracts to all the 70 teachers we wanted to retire who can still teach or who haven't made other arrangements," Mr. Peterson said.

The one-semester contracts were worked out after 19 of the 70 threatened court action to retain their right to teach for another year.

Terms of the compromise were disclosed last night when a health and safety teacher at Shortridge High School asked Board members to reconsider the policy retirement at the age of 66.

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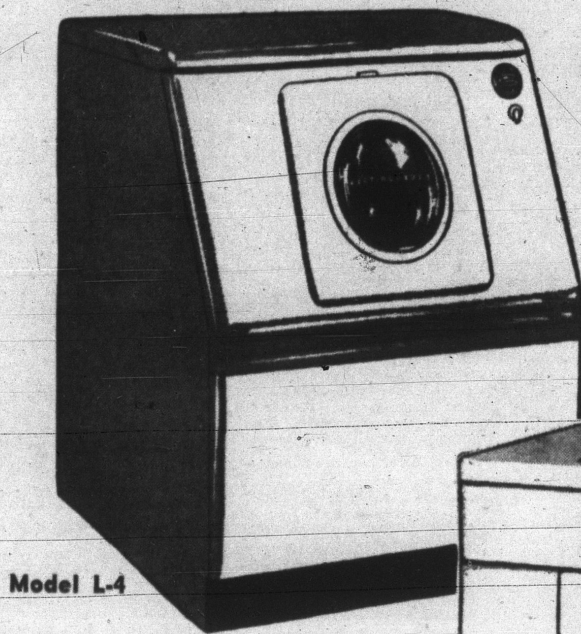


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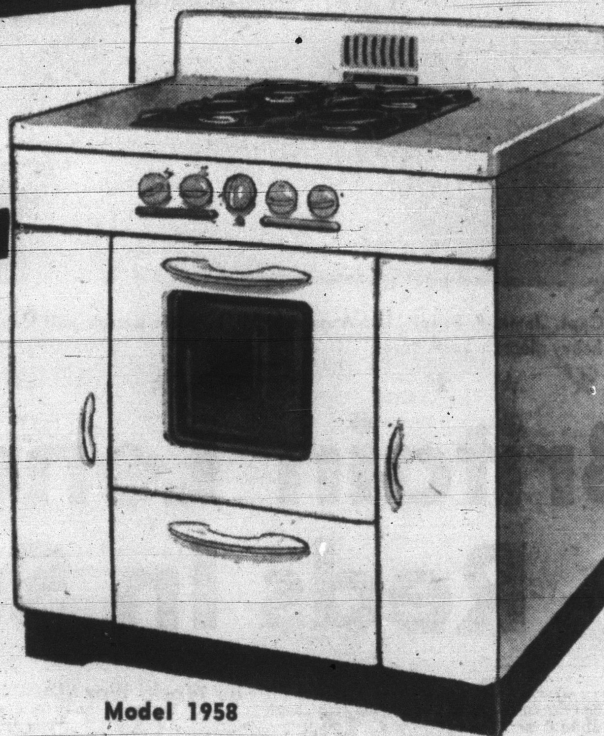


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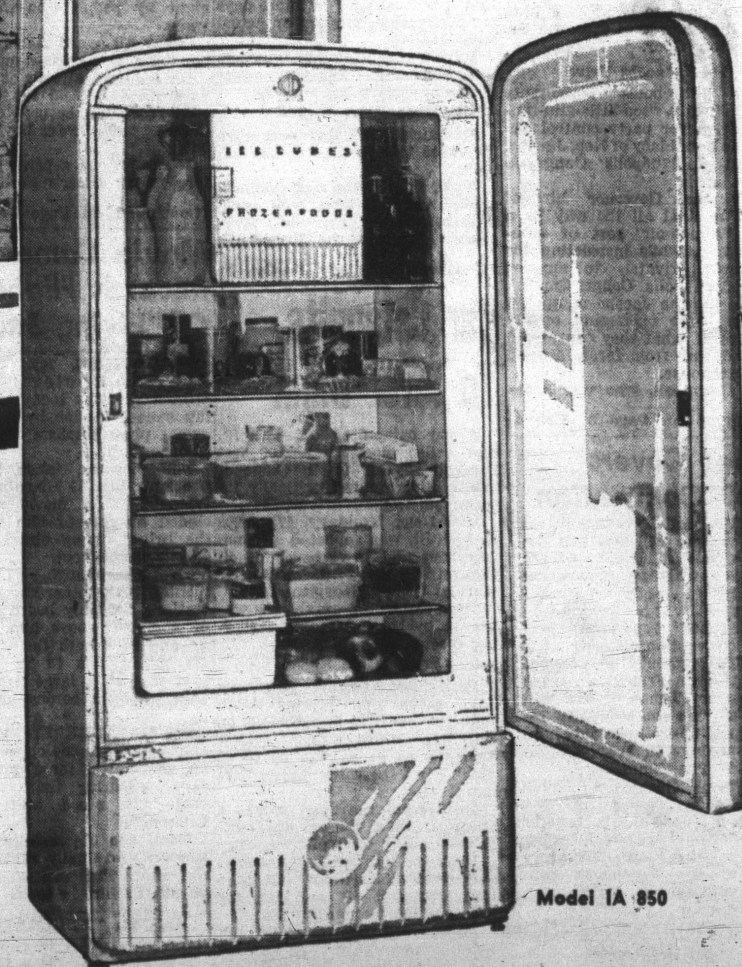
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
