Eat Well for Less—

Meat Loaf Is Always Welcome

Extend Beef Protein With Milk and Bacon

A NEW MEAT LOAF recipe is always welcome these days when meat prices are high. This recipe, by an old friend of this column, Lucy M. Maltby of Corning, N. Y., extends the beef protein with protein of milk, bread and bacon.

EASY MEAT LOAF

One and one-half pounds ground beef, one and one-half cups soft bread crumbs, one cup top milk, three tablespoons chopped onion, three tablespoons catsup, one-quarter teaspoon poultry seasoning, one and one-half teaspoons salt, one-quarter teaspoon pepper, 3 slices bacon.

Mix together ground beef, bread crumbs, milk, onion, catsup, poultry seasoning, salt and pepper. Spread in two-quart heat-resistant glass loaf pan.

Cut bacon slices in two; arrange on top of meat mixture. Bake in moderate oven, 350 degrees F., for about one hour. Lucy gives us another little item—this time for dessert. It's a party feature—rich, delicate and seasonal.

PINEAPPLE MOUSSE

One-half cup sugar, one tablespoon lemon juice, one cup shredded pineapple, one cup whipping cream, two tablespoons water, two egg whites, maraschino cherries for garnish (four-ounce bottle).

Add sugar and lemon juice to shredded pineapple; stir thoroughly. Whip cream; fold into pineapple mixture. Add water to egg whites and beat until stiff. Fold gently into pineapple mixture.

Arrange thin slices of maraschino cherries around inside of eight glass custard cups, five-ounce size. Pour in the pineapple mixture. Freeze in the freezing unit of refrigerator for about four hours or until firm all the way through.

Serve in the cups in which the mouse was frozen. The top of each dessert may be decorated with maraschino cherries. Serves eight.
