Huge Posse Hunts Missing Boy, 5

Wisconsin Woods Combed in Search

RHINELANDER, Wis., Aug. 30 (UPI)—A huge posse of volunteers and veteran woodsmen began a systematic search of the Lake Tomahawk wilderness today for a 5-year-old boy missing since Saturday.

Sheriff Melford Krouze appealed to all able-bodied men in this resort country to join forest rangers, game wardens and deputies in a bush-beating hunt through a five-mile-square area. He said he expected "several hundred" men to answer his call, broadcast over a local radio station. Authorities brought in "walkie-talkie" radios to aid the search.

The boy, David Blucher, disappeared without a trace from Dolhun's Resort, where he was staying with his mother, Mrs. Walter Blucher of Flossmoor, Ill. Sheriff Krouze appealed to all able-bodied men in this resort country to join forest rangers, game wardens and deputies in a bush-beating hunt through a five-mile-square area. He said he expected "several hundred" men to answer his call, broadcast over a local radio station. Authorities brought in "walkie-talkie" radios to aid the search.

His mother feared that he was abducted, but the sheriff leaned to the belief that the child wandered into the lake or became lost in the woods.

One hundred searchers have hunted through the woods and dragged the lake near the Blucher cabin.

Bloodhounds and planes were pressed into the search without success.

"The boy didn't leave a trace," the sheriff said.

Mrs. Blucher offered a \$250 reward for her son.

The boy's father, Executive Director of the American Society of Planning Officials, was reported en route here from Amsterdam, Holland, where he was attending a meeting when David disappeared.

2 DIE IN PLANE CRASH


