The Indiana Central College A. Capella Choir, directed by Allan Schirmer, will sing at the session at 7:30 tonight in the church. Missionaries from the Philippines, Switzerland, Africa, Japan, Germany and the United States will speak on "My Purpose: To Declare His Glory." Sumio Kolkie will give the prayer and Miss Flora Argie will play a piano solo.

Missionaries and guest ministers will preach in local pulpits tomorrow. Bishop George E. Epp, Naperville, Ill., episcopal head of the Central Area, will preach at 10:40 a. m. in the host church. The bishop has announced the sermon title, "The Wars Rise Up Against Me."

Religious Group Helps
Children's Character

Children will discover the adventure of religion if guided to do so by their teachers, Mrs. James Pontius maintains.

Mrs. Pontius, new director of religious education for the North Unitarian Church, is putting this theory into practice in the Sunday School. She is using the much-heralded lessons furnished by the Union College Character Research Project and Dr. Ernest Ligon, director, Schenectady, N. Y.

"We strive to make age-old beliefs such as the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes practical for the child so that he may apply them immediately to every day life," Mrs. Pontius explained. "And we establish cooperation between the parents and the school in the doing."

"In psychology, we think maybe the starting point in successful teaching for the formation of character is in the observation of the attitudes of children."

Dramatize Fire
"I recall that some boys in Schenectady, seeking adventure, set fire to dry leaves on a lawn. All the neighboring lawns also were covered with leaves. If the fire had not been stopped promptly, it might have become quite a conflagration."

"We noted the attitude of the children in doing this. The next Sunday in the church school, we suggested that they act out the theme: 'Is it fun to be bad?'"

"Some of the very boys who had kindled the fire suggested that we dramatize that episode. In the end, they fled just as they actually did at the time of the fire."

"Was it fun when you ran away from the burning leaves?" we asked in discussion after the play. "No. We were scared," the answer came back.

"Then what would have been more fun? And why did you start the fire?"

The drawing will be made with a musical background furnished by the host church choir under the direction of Richard Whittington. The program will open a series of Sunday evening musical offerings for the community given by the Meridian Heights Men.

The chalk artist will use regular chalks, fluorescent chalks, color-filtered lights and black lights to achieve his completed picture. It will be titled, "The Shepherd at Twilight."

Mr. Swartwout really will draw two pictures simultaneously but the audience will be able to see only one as he proceeds. At the close, the black light will cause the second scene to disappear brilliantly and the first to glow.

The artist is business manager of Baker's Helper, a trade journal published in Chicago. He has given hundreds of his chalk-talk musical programs throughout the country. Mr. Swartwout will accept no honorarium but performs free using his own intricate equipment of lights and the like. No collection will be taken at the meeting.

Lutheran Groups
Move to Merge

The American Lutheran Church will collaborate with the Evangelical Lutheran Church and the United Evangelical Lutheran Church on plans for a future merger.

The American Church, which is represented by three congregations in Indianapolis at its convention in Columbus, O., this week elected nine men to meet with similar delegations from the other two denominations. They will report to their respective conventions in 1952.

If their work is successful, it is "assured" that the actual organic union will take place. Other major resolutions passed by the American Lutheran convention were approval of the 1951 Mission Advance which calls for a doubling of the church budget for the coming year; approval of the work of the joint committee on liturgy and the hymnal; a basic plan for the proposed Lutheran Post-Graduate Theological Seminary; and a model constitution for the 13 districts of the American Lutheran Church.

Passover Service To Be Explained

The Englewood Christian Church will present what they call "an unique service" featuring a demonstration of the Jewish Feast of the Passover as related to the Lord's Supper of the Christian faith.

Wednesday at 7:30 p. m., the Rev. Harry Bucalstein, who was born of Jewish parents, will give the demonstration program in the Englewood Church. The Rev. Mr. Bucalstein grew up in a Jewish community. He is quite familiar with the practices of Judaism as well as those of Christianity. He is pastor of the West Morris Street Christian Church.

The Englewood congregation will set up a table arranged for Passover just as it is seen in Jewish homes at the time of the feast. The various symbolic foods and articles which have a part in the Passover story will be placed on the table. The Rev. Mr. Bucalstein will explain them. He will tell how Jesus and the Disciples were eating the Passover meal when the Lord's Supper was instituted.
