One-Year Contract
On first coming to Indianapolis in 1948, Lopez worked under a one-year contract. After guiding the Indians to the American Association pennant, he was given a new two-year contract, taking him through 1950.

After which he signed up again, calling for him to remain here through 1951. But when the new contract was signed, it was agreed by both parties that Lopez would be free to accept any major league offer that met with his approval.

The Times learned that Al had received offers all right—at least two—but he displayed no interest in leaving Indianapolis until the Cleveland Indians entered the picture.

Now the Indianapolis club must search for a new pilot for the Victory Field Indians.

Messrs. McKinney and Bush both said today they would have to "take their time."

Everything Fast!

About Don Gutteridge, his playing-coach in Indianapolis, Lopez told The Times today by telephone from Cleveland that "everything has happened so fast that I haven't had time to discuss Cleveland coaches. Don is a good fellow and a good worker, but I'll have to go over those plans with the club's top officials."

In local baseball circles, it is believed that Gutteridge will be offered the Tribe managerial post if he doesn't accompany Lopez to Cleveland.

Lopez plans to come to Indianapolis Sunday or Monday for a farewell conference with Messrs. McKinney and Bush and to help them in their plans for 1951.

The Lopez-to-Cleveland move had its inception at the World Series. At a dinner, attended by Hank Greenberg, Cleveland's general manager, and Messrs. McKinney and Lopez, the spark was touched off by the Cleveland official.

Cleveland officials and McKinney had been discussing the deal since in one of the best-kept secrets in baseball history. However, a couple of months ago, The Times linked Lopez with the Cleveland assignment but was maneuvered off the trail.

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico, Nov. 10 (UPI)—The body of Grisello Torresola, who was shot down while trying to assassinate President Truman, arrived here today by air from New York for burial.

A large group of plainclothes police, headed by Assistant Attorney General Jose Aponte, patrolled Isla Grande Airport when the Pan American plane landed.

Rafael Perez Roura, a cousin, accompanied the body. He was met by Alfredo Plate, Torresola's brother-in-law. But there were few others on hand and no other relatives.

Gambler Seeks License For Armored Car

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 10 (UPI)—Gambler Mickey Cohen, alleged head of the Los Angeles underworld, wants the state to explain in court why it won't license his \$16,000 armored car.

Cohen filed a petition for a writ ordering Commissioner Clifford E. Peterson of the highway patrol to issue a permit.

Superior Judge W. Turney Fox ruled in favor of the former haberdasher yesterday and ordered Peterson to show cause Nov. 29 why Cohen should not be given the permit.

Six Hurt in Chicago Apartment Hotel Fire

CHICAGO, Nov. 10 (UPI)—A flash fire today panicked 130 residents of a south side apartment hotel and hospitalized six persons with burns and injuries.

Firemen and residents of nearby buildings rescued more than 50 persons trapped in the Dornell apartment hotel by dense, billowing smoke and prevented what police said might have been a major tragedy.

No one was killed.




