Dates Are Listed

Any grammar school pupil who will not be 16 before May 25 may compete. Preliminary spellings for grammar school pupils in Indianapolis will be held in city park community centers. Second round of the preliminaries will be the week of Apr. 16. Semifinals will be held Apr. 27, and the finals Apr. 28.

Marion county schools will hold their own eliminations. Two winners from each township will compete against Indianapolis winners in the semifinals.

The final winner will spend a week in Washington, D. C. to see the sights and compete in the National Spelling Bee.

Valuable prizes will be awarded in both the local and national competitions.

Atomic Particles Counted in Flash

Device Takes Only Billionth of Second

STANFORD UNIVERSITY, Cal., Mar. 8.—An atomic particle can be counted in a billionth of a second by a new electronic technique developed by Stanford physicists.

Advantage is taken in the improved device of the fluorescent light that flashes when an atomic particle passes through suitable crystals or liquids.

The scintillation counter made by Dr. Richard F. Post and a team of physicists gets extra speed by operating at 4000 volts instead of the 1000 volts used on tubes of earlier scintillation counters, which are supersensitive cousins of Geiger counters.

State Highway Detours Listed

The State Highway Commission today announced the following detours on highways closed because of construction:

Ind. 1—North of Greendale: two miles over city streets and county road.
Ind. 16—Closed immediately west of Denver in Miami County: detour one mile over county roads.
Ind. 36—Bridges out one mile west of Road 1 in Jay County: detour 11 miles over Roads 30, 27 and 1.
Ind. 22—East of Milledale: 10 miles over Roads 12, 13.
Ind. 25—Bridges out and construction 3 miles east of Terra Haute: detour 25 miles over Road 45 and 12.
Ind. 26—From Road 14 to Road 19 in Jasper County: 25 miles over Roads 14, 15 and 16.
Ind. 46—Closed North of Owensville for bridge repair: detour 15 miles over Roads 41 and 18.
Ind. 66—Closed South of Mt. Vernon: detour four miles over county roads (one bridge damaged by high water, another wrecked by truck. Ferry closed at Ohio River).
Ind. 114—From Road 105 to Road 9 in Hamilton and Whitley counties: 18 miles over Roads 105, 14 and 9.
Ind. 202—Ferry closed at Wabash River.

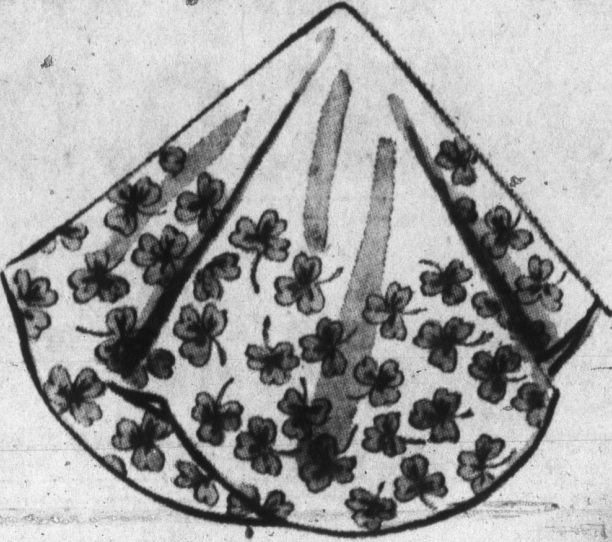

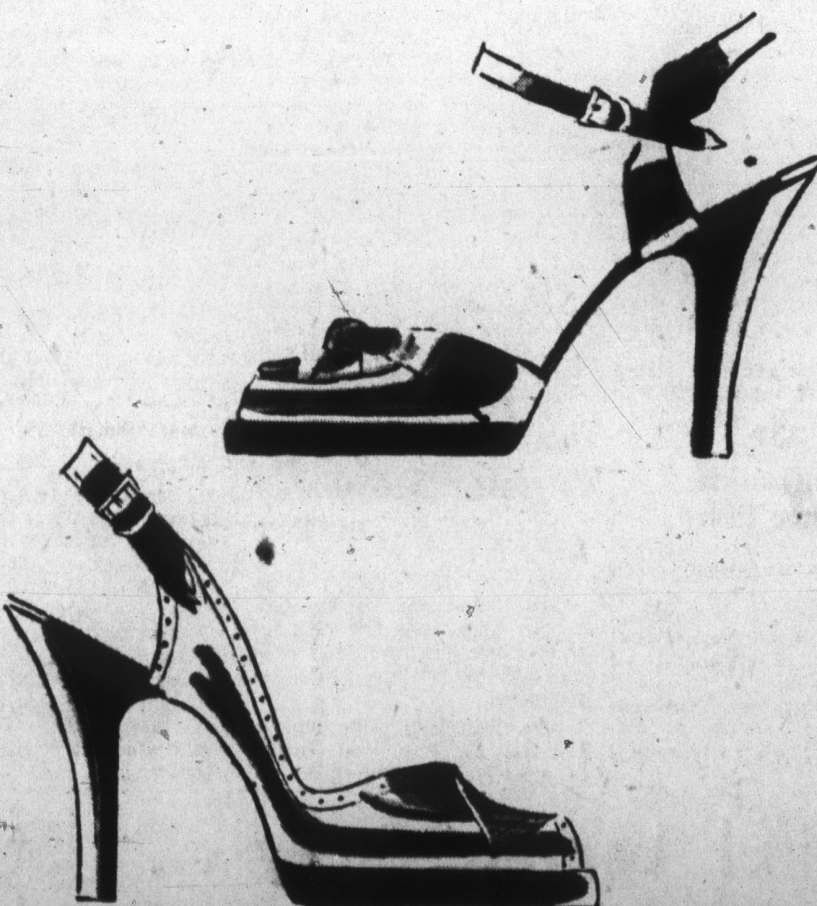

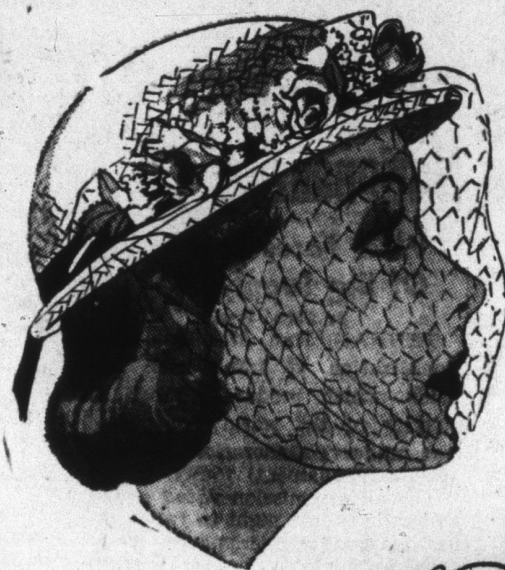
