## Catholic Women To Convene Here

NCCW Parley  
Set Apr. 8-9

Catholic women of 119 parishes and 32 missions will assemble here for the 12th annual convention of the Indianapolis Archdiocesan Council of the National Council of Catholic Women April 8 and 9.

A Pontifical Low Mass April 9 at 9:30 a.m. in St. John's Church will open the convention proper. Highlights of the day will include departmental discussions, a luncheon and addresses in the Claypool Hotel. The board of directors will meet on Sunday, April 8, at 4 p.m. to elect officers and for a dinner meeting in the hotel.

The Most Rev. Paul C. Schulte, archbishop of Indianapolis, will be the celebrant for the mass and the Rev. Thomas Fields, St. Patrick's Church pastor, will preach. Various priests will assist with the services. The council choir will sing motets directed by Mrs. Clay Britton and accompanied by Mrs. William Morgan, organist.

### Visiting Bishop

Archbishop Schulte will speak, pronounce the invocation for the luncheon session and a blessing at the close of the convention. The Most Rev. Leo Pursey, D.D., auxiliary bishop of St. Wayne, will give the principal afternoon address. Others to be heard include: Mrs. Gerald Bennett, Grand Rapids, Mich., national president of the NCCW; and Mrs. George Moser, New Albany, archdiocesan president, who will give the president's message and preside. Mrs. John A. Murphy, deanery president, will welcome the delegates.

Departmental groups, each with a priest as moderator and a woman chairman, will meet in the forenoon April 9. Groups will discuss organization, libraries, literature study clubs, missions, the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, Census, Youth, press, publicity, rural life, welfare, legislation, history and retreats.

### 'Evangelize or Die' Is Topic for Rally

Dr. Orie D. Pruitt will speak on "Evangelize or Die" at a rally for members of the Indianapolis Baptist Association Monday at 7:45 p.m. in the First Baptist Church. Dr. Pruitt is host pastor.

Members of the association, representing the denomination's churches in the Indianapolis area, will elect officers for the coming year and transact other business. Dr. Clive McGuire, executive secretary for the association, is in charge of meeting plans.

The passage reads: "We welcome the increase of knowledge and the end of error, because even human invention must have its day, and we want that day to be succeeded by Christian Science, by divine reality."

Mrs. Mae Yoho Ward will visit Latin American missions of the United Christian Missionary Society for the next two months.

Mrs. Ward, a foreign missions executive secretary of the Disciples of Christ Society, will fly from Weir Cook Airport tomorrow morning. Her entire trip made by commercial airliners will take her to Florida, Jamaica, Chile, Argentina and Paraguay. The Disciples maintain 47 missionaries in Latin America.

## Protestants to Discuss Global Issues, World Peace

Conference, Sponsored by Federation,  
Set Wednesday in First Friends Church

Protestants of Indianapolis will meet for discussion of world problems and the possibilities for a lasting peace Wednesday in the First Friends Church.

The conference, or Institute on Internal Relations, will be sponsored by the Indianapolis Church Federation in cooperation with the host church.

Clarence E. Pickett, former secretary of the American Friends Service Committee, and Dr. Thomas E. Jones, president of Earlham College, will give the main addresses. Mr. Pickett served the committee in its work of relief and rehabilitation abroad for 20 years. While friends of many faiths contribute to the American Friends Service Committee, it primarily is a Quaker organization.

### Speakers' Schedule

Mr. Pickett will speak at 10:30 a.m. and again at the 6:30 p.m. dinner session. Dr. Jones is scheduled for an address at 1:30 p.m. Both men will serve as resource leaders for five discussion groups meeting in the afternoon following the talk by Dr. Jones.

Mr. Pickett will speak at the dinner meeting, Mrs. E. B. Foster will give a report titled: "The United Nations at the Grass Roots." Discussion groups will present summaries of their afternoon meetings.

The first discussion group will follow the topic: "The Present World Situation in the Light of the Heath Memorial Methodist Church.

Subjects to be discussed on five Sunday nights in order are: "The Gambling Issue"; "The Alcohol Issue"; "The Problem of City Government"; "The Race Issue" and "Breakdowns of the Family."

Dr. Howard J. Baumgartel, executive secretary of the Church Federation, will serve as moderator tomorrow night for the discussion of gambling. Prosecutor Frank Fairchild, Rep. Thomas Hasbrook (R, Indianapolis) and Harold Hatcher, chairman of social education and action of the Church Federation, will speak.


