

Burns Fatal to Mother Who Rescued Her Baby

A 26-year-old Indianapolis mother died early today of burns suffered Wednesday when she rescued her infant son from their blazing home.

She was Mrs. Vivian Burge, 26, of 701 Martin St. Her baby, Harry Burge Jr., 15 months, was still in critical condition today in General Hospital, where Mrs. Burge died.

Four other persons were burned less seriously in the fire, started by a stove explosion.

Wife of Sen. Tobey Dies

PETERBOROUGH, N. H., Jan. 1. (UPI)—Mrs. Loretta C. Tobey, 57, wife of Sen. Charles W. Tobey (R. N. H.), died of a cerebral hemorrhage.

She leaves three sons by her former marriage, David W. Rabenhorst, of Simsbury, Conn., Forrest W. and Daniel C. Rabenhorst, both of Washington.

The Tobey family's physician, Dr. Claire Cayward of Greenville, said Mrs. Tobey had been in "excellent health" until she was stricken suddenly at her home in nearby Temple yesterday afternoon.

A former Washington, D.C., school teacher, Mrs. Tobey had been the Senator's secretary before their marriage May 6, 1948, in Washington. It was the second marriage for both.

Mrs. Tobey had nursed her hus-

bard during an illness last summer when the 71-year-old Senator suffered a cerebral hemorrhage.

She leaves three sons by her former marriage, David W. Rabenhorst, of Simsbury, Conn., Forrest W. and Daniel C. Rabenhorst, both of Washington.

The Bible-quoting Senator married the widow after his first wife died in 1947. At the time he told Vice President Alben W. Barkley, also a widower: "Go thou and do likewise."

A short while later Mr. Barkley also remarried.


