Twelfth Night Program At Ripple Tomorrow

Flames taller than the house-tops will light the evening sky tomorrow when the Twelfth Night bonfire burns in Broad Ripple Park.

Discarded Christmas trees, stripped of their ornaments and tinsel, will renew their glory for a brief moment before sinking to ashes.

The burning of the trees will begin at 7 p. m. and last just 30 minutes to allow the spectators to get to Sunday evening worship or programs afterward in their churches.

The Twelfth Night, or Epiphany, celebration recalls the visit of the Three Wise Men to the Bethlehem Manger. It will be sponsored here by the churches in the northern part of the city and the Broad Ripple Business Men's Association. Eugene Roeger and Jack Higgins are co-chairmen for the event.

Mayor Clark will be special guest. The 47-voice Children's Choir of St. Paul's Episcopal Church will sing, and Wally Nehrling of Radio Station WIRE will speak. Boy Scouts will serve as guards to make sure the blaze keeps within bounds.


Highlights will include talks by missionaries from the foreign fields of India, Burma and Africa. Poster and attendance contests are being planned to keep interest at a high pitch.

Rev. Martin to Speak

Among the active missionaries who will speak will be the Rev. John Clough Martin, son and grandson of missionaries to India, who has served the Baptist Church in that country for the past 16 years. He recently was stationed in the Cumbum field in India, which extends over 2000 square miles and embraces 250 villages with more than 15,000 Baptist inhabitants.

Rev. Martin came to the United States for his college and seminary education and served rural churches in New York State before returning to India as a missionary.

The conference program will illustrate the theme: "The Gates of Hell Shall Not Prevail."

Hospitalized Servicemen Get Income Tax Break

WASHINGTON, Jan. 5 (UP)—Servicemen who have been hospitalized because of wounds, illness or injury may be eligible for income tax refunds.

The Defense Department reminded such servicemen today that the tax law has been amended to provide income tax exemption during the period they were hospitalized and is retroactive to June 24, 1950. The serviceman's tax return must be accompanied by a certificate of hospitalization from unit personnel officers.
