

## Misconduct Cases to Go Before Juries

WASHINGTON, Mar. 3—Government cleanup man Newbold Morris announced yesterday he plans to name prominent local lawyers in cities where he uncovers wrongdoing by U. S. employees to present the cases to federal grand juries.

He made the disclosure in an interview on the National Broadcasting Co. television program, "Meet the Press."

Mr. Morris also made it plain he will quit if President Truman does not fire federal officials who fail to answer the forthcoming income questionnaire. He said the questionnaire will go to some 25,000 federal jobholders.

Slaps at O'Dwyer

The cleanup chief indicated that he would not have named former New York Mayor William O'Dwyer to be ambassador to Mexico nor would he have had Maj. Gen. Harry H. Vaughan on the presidential payroll.

A reporter noted that Gen. Vaughan, Mr. Truman's military aide whose name figured in Senate "five percenter" hearings in 1950, has not been removed from his post.

"Not yet," Mr. Morris replied.

Asked about Mr. O'Dwyer's appointment, he said he was "like waving a red flag in front of a bull" since he was Mr. O'Dwyer's unsuccessful opponent for mayor of New York.

Pressed, he added:

"I wouldn't have appointed him."

As for Gen. Vaughan, he said "I wouldn't have had him there to begin with."

Mr. Morris said he felt his job as originally announced was "too closely identified" with Attorney Gen. J. Howard McGrath, but asserted that "I have changed the pitch since then."

Truman to Set Date

He referred to the fact that his offices are being set up outside the Justice Department. He also said his reports will go directly to Mr. Truman. Coples will go to the Justice Department "except if it involves misconduct in trading."

Mr. Morris said if he uncovers any cases of corruption or misconduct in the government, he personally will decide whether to prosecute.

"I will find a leading member of the bar in any city where there is misconduct and ask him to go before a Federal Grand Jury," he said.

He explained that the lawyer would be his deputy before the jury, although prosecution of the case in the courts later would be up to the U. S. attorney's office in that area.

Morris 25,000

Mr. Morris indicated his questionnaires will be "very searching."

"They are going to irritate about 25,000 people and 100,000 people are going to be very interested in the results," he said.

He said officials will be given about two weeks to answer, with some leeway if there is a good excuse.

"But if some refuse to answer out of arrogance, they will have to stand up and be dismissed by presidential order," he declared.

Mr. Morris said he "believe" Mr. Truman will use his "discipline" power to dismiss such employees and he has assurances to that effect. If the President fails to act, he added that he has "another weapon":

"I'll go home."

## UN Accused of Dropping Plague Fleas on Truce Site

TOKYO, Mar. 3—The Chinese Communists today accused American planes of dropping fleas carrying bubonic plague near truce headquarters at Panmunjom and elsewhere in North Korea.

The accusation, made in a Radio Peking broadcast heard in Tokyo, was based on dispatches by Communist newsmen Alan Winnington and Wilfred Burnett.

At the same time, a United Press dispatch from Hong Kong said an epidemic of bubonic plague, cholera and other contagious diseases of serious proportions appears to have broken out in North Korea.
