Three Are Held In \$100,000 Air Station Robbery

NEW YORK, May 22—FBI agents yesterday arrested a former private detective and a red-haired nightclub singer who were out on a Manhattan spending spree and held them in connection with a \$100,000 robbery at the Naval Air Station on Quonset Point, R. I.

Another man was arrested at West Warwick, R. I., in connection with the Mar. 7 hold-up.

Agents here seized Howard Hildebrandt, 25, and singer Gloria Dale, 30, while they were eating at a restaurant in the bright light district.

A Free Spender

Hildebrandt, who lives with his wife and two children in West Warwick, and Miss Dale had been spending their evenings in Greenwich Village at Tony Pastor's Night Club where Miss Dale sings. It was learned that Hildebrandt sometimes spent as much as \$150 to \$200 a night.

Meanwhile, agents in West Warwick arrested Robert R. Laplante, 27-year-old Air Force veteran who was employed as a mechanic at the Quonset Air Station until last week.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover, who announced the arrests in Washington, said Hildebrandt and Laplante were charged with robbery on a government reservation. Miss Dale, who has been singing at Pastor's since April 16, was held as a material witness.

Bandits Wore Overalls

The Quonset robbery was staged by two men who wore overalls, overshirts and covered their faces with flesh-colored elastic masks.

The \$100,000 was being delivered to the air station's credit union office when the men seized it from the office manager and a guard and fled in an automobile.

Hildebrandt's a cquaintances said his current spending spree was one in a series. They said he had been making a habit of leaving his wife in West Warwick and coming to New York for a few days where he often bought five or six bottles of champagne a night and tossed money around like cabbage.

But apparently Hildebrandt made no effort to shower his wife with luxuries, preferring to spend money in the company of singers, it was said.

The arrests climaxed an intensive search for those involved in the well-planned robbery.
