"OH, SO you won't talk," said the big, burly policeman with a kindly voice, as he handed the "prisoner" another ice cream cone.

The grubby hand of a 3-year-old grabbed the cone and smiled. He was having a time.

For six hours juvenile aid officers "grilled" the lad, but not a word could they understand. He had been found wandering around Technical High School.

So they finally took him for a ride to the neighborhood. They hoped it would refresh his memory.

All the time the lad chattered away

in a strange and foreign-sounding tongue. Near the school someone suggested they try 704 West Dr., Woodruff Place.

Sure enough, there Mrs. Adeltheide Skudrovski, 22, greeted the lad like her long lost son. Only she didn't know he was lost. She thought he was with his father, a welder at a local factory.

And the policemen found out why they couldn't understand the youngster whose name turned out to be Harold.

He only came to this country from Germany six months ago and can't speak a word of English. What he was chattering was a child's version of German.

Garfield Rites Set Tomorrow

'Tough Guy' Victim Of a Heart Attack

NEW YORK, May 22—Funeral services for John Garfield, 39, a former juvenile delinquent who rose to movie stardom as a tough guy, will be held tomorrow at Riverside Memorial Chapel here.

Mr. Garfield died yesterday of a heart attack in the apartment of actress Iris Whitney, 36, where he had spent the night after complaining of feeling ill when they returned from dinner Tuesday.

Miss Whitney said the actor had refused her offer to call a doctor and said all he needed was a few hours' sleep. He retired to the bedroom, Miss Whitney said, and she spent the night on the living room couch.

When she tried to awaken him yesterday morning, Miss Whitney said, he did not respond. She called a physician who pronounced him dead.

Detectives and city health officers said there was nothing suspicious about Mr. Garfield's death. The medical examiner's office ascribed his death to a cardiac condition.

Mr. Garfield was the star of numerous films, including "The Postman Always Rings Twice," "Fugate," "Tortilla Flat," and "Body and Soul." His stage roles included parts in "Golden Boy," "Having a Wonderful Time," "Waiting For Lefty," "Awake and Sling" and "Peace On Earth."

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DEATH KEEPS A DATE—Iris Whitney, dancer and actress, who found John Garfield, film star, dead in bed in her New York apartment yesterday. A doctor said Mr. Garfield had died of a "cardiac condition."

German Reds Warn of War

Bonn Peace Deal Held 'Final Blow'

BERLIN, May 22—East German Premier Otto Grotewohl said last night that West Germany's separate peace treaty with the Western Allies would wreck chances for unification and bring the country to the brink of civil war.

Mr. Grotewohl's warning came as Allied Big Three and West German delegates announced at Bonn that the peace treaty—technically known as a peace contract—was now ready for signature by the four foreign ministers next Monday.

The East German premier told the Communist national front council that the treaty would "bring Germany into the immediate neighborhood of civil war and a new third world war."

He said signing of the pact would be "the final blow" to Communist attempts to bring about understanding and unity between the East and West German governments.

A communique issued after the council meeting called on East Germany to rearm to meet the threat posed by the new treaty.

"This hour of national emergency makes it necessary that the people of the (East) German Democratic Republic raise their own national defense forces," the communique said.

It accused West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer of plotting to split Germany permanently and turn the Western zones into a "colony of American imperialism under 'plague-general' Matthew B. Ridgway as governor-general."

Gen. Ridgway will succeed Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower as Supreme Allied Commander in Europe next week.

Hoosier Helps Daring Rescue In Red Korea

TOKYO, May 22—A Hoosier medical technician today took part in a daring helicopter rescue of a Marine fighter pilot, shot down behind Communist lines in Korea.

Airman 2/c John Withers, Bedford, teamed with Capt. Charles A. Johnson, Paradise, Cal., to drop their unarmed, slow-flying craft into a Red-ruled area of North Korea to rescue within an hour Capt. William J. Barbanen, of New York City.

Capt. Barbanen had bailed out of his fighter plane after it had been crippled by enemy ground fire. He was flying his 100th and last mission from the aircraft carrier USS Bataan.

Other carrier fighters flew protective cover while the helicopter landed and picked up the downed pilot. Communist rifle fire peppered the plane as it flew away but no one aboard was hit.

Veronica Lake Acts To End 8-Year Marriage

HOLLYWOOD, Cal., May 22—(UP)—Veronica Lake, 29, who rose to screen stardom by draping her long blond hair over one eye, today sought to end her 8-year marriage to film director Andre Detocht, 37.

The actress filed a suit charging mental cruelty and stating, thus she and Mr. Detocht had been living apart since Aug. 15, 1950. They were married here Dec. 16, 1944. She said they had reached an agreement placing their three children in joint custody.

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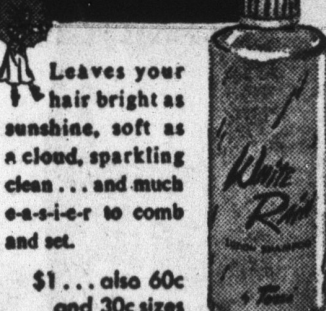
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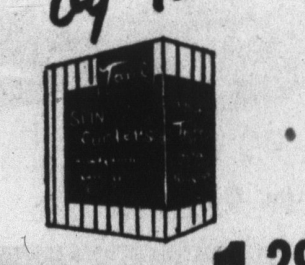
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
