County Committee.

Democrats Meet Saturday, January 25th 1908.

The Democratic County Central Committee met Saturday in the Court house for the purpose of fixing the date of holding the county and township primary and to adopt rules governing the same.

There was a large attendance, nearly every committee man being present. The meeting was presided over by M. A. Sweeney with J. P. Huther as secretary.

The rules that have heretofore governed the primaries with some few amendments were adopted and March 17 was fixed upon as the date on which to hold the primaries in all the precincts. The convention will be held the following day at the Court House in Jasper at which the vote cast in the primary will be canvassed and the ticket to be voted for at the general election will be announced.

The following assessments for candidates were agreed upon: Congressman, Treasurer and Sheriff each \$50.00. Commissioners \$10; Surveyor \$2.50; Coroner \$5; Township Trustee and Assessor each \$10. February 29th was fixed as the last day for candidates to pay their assessments. Addresses were delivered by John L. Bretz, W. D. Cull, Harry Carpenter, Henry Landrebe and Leroy Cive. Following resolutions were unanimously adopted;

Resolved, that the Democracy of Dubois county, as expressed through its County Central Committee, assembled at Jasper, Indiana, on the 25th day of January, 1908, do view with pride the splendid work by our Representative in Congress the Honorable William E. Cox, during the short period of time that he has been a member of that distinguished body and that we as representatives of the Democracy of Dubois County, in committee assembled, do earnestly and faithfully recommend him, not only to the Democracy of the county, but to the District as a Candidate to succeed himself in this important position.

Whereas, the Hon. Ed P Richardson, who was selected as chairman of the Joint Primary Election Commission, having resigned on account of being related to one of the candidates and said resignation having been accepted, and whereas the Hon. M. A. Sweeney and Frank Ely, chairman of the Central Committees of the counties of Dubois and Pike have made written appointment of Robert Gray, a competent and proper person of Otwell, Indiana to fill said vacancy, now therefore the Democratic Central Committee of Dubois County in lawful session approves and confirms said appointment and requests the Central Committee of Pike County at their meeting on February 3d, 1908 to do the same.

Whereas it having been a time honored and respected custom in the Joint Representative district composed of the counties of Dubois and Pike, that the office of Joint Representative should alternate between said two counties at each biennial election, and whereas according to said custom, said office should have gone to Pike county at the election in November 1906, but by inadvertence a citizen of Dubois county was nominated and elected to said office, and whereas at a regularly convened session of the Democratic Central Committee of this county in April 1907, said committee adopted a resolution conceding the office of Joint Representative to Pike county at the November election of 1908, therefore be it resolved by the Democratic Central Committee of Dubois County in lawful session assembled, that it still approves and emphasizes the resolution of April 1907, and hereby requests the Joint Primary Election Commission not to accept any money tendered by any citizen of Dubois county, to have his name placed on the ticket as a candidate for said office, and not to place the name of any person from Dubois county on the ticket for said office of Joint Representative to be voted for in the Joint Primary Election to be held on the 17th day of March, 1908.

Resolved that a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Central committee of Pike county, and they are requested to adopt a similar resolution for the guidance of the said Joint Primary Election Commission.

The more the better element in the Democratic party considers the matter of who is to be the next judge the more important it seems that Judge Ely should be nominated. There is no question but that his defeat would be a long step backward in the matter of reform. The moral tone in this county is far better than it has ever been and this is patent to every one and is due solely to the strict enforcement of the law under the present judge.
