W.M. B. COOPER, SUICIDE.

W.M. B. Cooper, well known as a stock buyer, committed suicide at Washington Ind., Jan. 24, 1908.

We clip the following account from the Washington Democrat.

W.M. Cooper a corn dealer who came here from Oakland City a week ago and was staying at the Globe hotel, committed suicide Friday noon by shooting himself through the brain with a revolver.

Just at what time the shot was fired no one knows. No one about the hotel heard the shot, and on this account it is believed the man took his life just as one of the B. & O. Southwestern passenger trains pulled into the depot, the stranger relying on the noise of the train to deaden the report made by his revolver.

His body was found about 3:30 by Am Comarios, keeper of the "Globe" hotel saloon. Comarios had missed Cooper for sometime and went to his room to ascertain what had kept him away. He pushed the door open it being barricaded by a chair, and found Cooper dead. Coroner Bonham was notified.

Cooper left a sealed note addressed to his wife. He also left a short note telling that whisky was the cause of his action. He had been drinking since here, although acquaintances say that he had not drunk to excess. He leaves a family at Oakland City.

Cooper was between forty-five and fifty-five years of age.
