IT WON'T WORK.

Mr. R. F. Watson, an Indianapolis lawyer and legal author, has written to the Phalanx, the Prohibition organ, to the effect that there cannot be a county unit and a township unit at the same time. He therefore declares that the enactment of a local option law for the county would necessarily destroy the township unit for remonstrance, and that if a county should vote wet it would be wet all over.
