The most beautiful apartment in Windsor castle is said to be the state dining-room, which is decorated with cream and gold and communicates with the red drawing-room, according to the New York Journal.

Queen Alexandra generally dines in the oak room, but when many guests are staying at the castle the state-room is used instead. The queen does not take the head of the table, but always sits with her back to the fireplace. One of the windows overlooks the eastern terrace, where the band plays on Sundays. This is the fashionable promenade of the residents of Windsor. An enormous silver-gilt punch bowl stands in this dining-room which was ordered by King George IV. and cost £10,000. It is capable of holding eight gallons, and on the occasion of the prince of Wales' wedding was filled with 210 bottles of mulled claret.
