What Foods Weigh.

It may be convenient to know that one quart of flour weighs one pound; a quart of cornmeal, one pound and two ounces; a quart of best sugar, one pound; a quart of powdered white sugar, one pound and one ounce; a quart of best brown sugar, one pound and two ounces; that ten g's weigh one pound, though this depends somewhat on the size; sixteen large tablespoons make half a pint; a quart of butter, one pound and one ounce.

To Wash Chamois Leather.

Make a weak solution of soap and warm water. Rub plenty of soft soap into the leather and let it soak for two hours, then rub it till quite clean. Afterward rinse it well in a weak solution of warm water, soda and yellow soap. After rinsing wring it well in a rough towel, dry quickly and pull about till quite soft. It will then be better than most new leathers.

The Right Way to Proceed in Washing Delicate China.

A big wooden bowl filled with warm, not boiling, soapuds, to which a few drops of household ammonia have been added, should be prepared and each piece of china washed separately in this, using a square of old flannel for plain plates, etc., and a soft brush (a painter's brush is best) for elaborately ornamental articles.

Rinse in another wooden bowl of clean warm water and dry with linen cloths. Bronze ornaments may be washed in the same way, but should be finally polished with a chamois leather. Some people consider a rub with a rag on which there is the least suspicion of paraffin gives bronze a nice appearance. Glass should be washed in warm water that has a little ammonia in it, but no soap, and then rinsed in quite cold water. Cut glass should be washed with a brush, or if elaborately cut and very dirty it is rather a good plan not to wash it at all, but brush a paste of whiting and water well into it, allowing it to dry on thoroughly, then removing it with a clean brush and finally polishing with an old silk handkerchief.

Baked Shad.

Clean a shad and stuff with mashed potatoes to which is added a teaspoon of finely minced parsley. Lay the fish on a baking dish on several slices of salt pork. Bake and baste often with the fat from the pork.

Sponge carpets occasionally with hot water in which either common salt or powdered alum has been dissolved. This not only brightens the carpets, but prevents moths.
