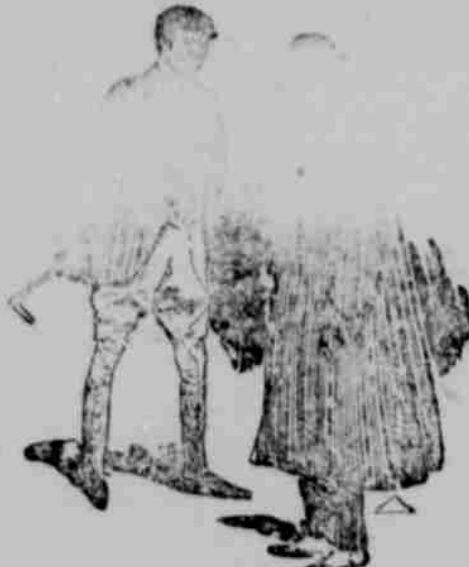
"DO YOU THINK MY WIFE WILL GET IN?"
