



FOR EARLY SPRING WEAR

Newest Blouses Are Dainty and
Appeal to All Women.

Delicate Pastel Shades Run Rival to
Bizarre; Many Designs to
Choose From.

Refreshingly dainty are the newest blouses for early spring wear to accompany the street suit. Delicate pastel shades run rival to bizarre Persian chiffon, and among materials one may allow her fancy to wander from the sheer georgette and chiffon to the more substantial, though none the less lovely, crepe meteore. The soft silk and accordion-plaited skirts of this season form the better half of a smart costume when allied with a pretty blouse.

A blouse of simple charm was recently seen fashioned of Persian chiffon in myriad colors—soft blues blending with sea green and then shot through with brilliant yellow. This clever blouse wisely chose a kimono model with short sleeves and then, as a charming afterthought, added a handkerchief cuff reaching nearly to the wrist.

The neck was outlined with a narrow piping of satin and tiny ribbons tied the sleeves. But the bottom was perhaps the most interesting feature, for it was finished with a casing and had a ribbon drawn through, and ended in a fetching bow at the waist. Of course this lovely blouse is worn over a skirt and goes equally as well with a suit or separately with a silk skirt to form an attractive afternoon frock.

An overblouse to be smart must be simple and have good lines, that is

sleeve, as all fashionable blouses do this season, but cleverly trims itself with jade green wool embroidery. It stretches the bottom and sleeve ends and then traces a few sprigs of flowers across the front. Around the waist there is a girdle made of the green wool braided together and tasseled at the ends.

Fetching Tea Frock.
Tea frocks of embroidery batiste and flounces of fliet set off net and apron tunics of batiste are worn at southern resorts. A frock of white challis having a large emerald green polka dot design and emerald green satin ribbon was run through white silk fagoting in three tiers of the skirt. It finished the short sleeves and surplice lines of the waist. A wide sash girdle of green ended in one large loop. Two long raveled ends fell from the left hip.

Veil Worn as Mask.
The chapeau of the season is unquestionably the black bicorne, close fitting when worn with the morning tailleur, large and flat and picturesque for afternoon. Sometimes it is bordered with narrow gold and silver fringe, and always veiled in Chantilly or tulle, embroidered with large designs in contrasting color. With close-fitting toques the veil is often worn as a mask, concealing chin and mouth, but revealing the eyes.

Sweaters for Spring.
New sweaters for spring are interesting coatlike models. They are of silk, and have pockets, belts and collars. Sleeves are long, and many are flared at the waist.

Late Styles Are "Egyptian"

Hats Are to Adopt New Form Named
After the Sphinx of the
Desert.

The latest Paris touch, "Egyptian." A single word but of what significance. Hats are to adopt a new form named after the sphinx of the desert, which translated technically means a toque effect with earlaps. A new blue of exceeding richness is about to appear based on the blue of the little statuettes found in the sarcophagi in the pyramids. It will be appropriately known as Egyptian blue.

Amulets will be worn, not of the orthodox variety, but rather little medallions for the front of hats and gowns, in order to modernize the charms worn on their foreheads by the Egyptian women.

The lotus and the scarab will be brought out from the dust of the tomb to adorn the headwear of the women of 1920. Egyptian forms and designs having been accepted, the prevailing colors will be the rich reds, blues and blacks that are found on the papyrus manuscripts.

Handbags will depart from their traditional lines for a season and will emulate Egyptian ideas in patterned silks, beaded designs and galalith frames adorned with separate motifs.

Chemise Blouse.

A new blouse is kimono-sleeved and cut as loosely as a chemise. The side seams are slashed up from hip to waist line and each corner of the lower edge is extended in a little tab. These

tabs—two on each side—tie loosely, drawing the edge of the blouse closely about the hips and giving a tapering line to the loose garment. One of these new blouses is of white crepe chine with lines of white bead embroidery outlining a V neck, running out along the shoulder and down from shoulder to bust.

JERSEY SILK FOR BLOUSES

Slip-Over Garment, With Peplum, Still
Smartest Vogue; Fabric Is
Desirable.

Jersey cloth in silk, in one of the weaves that go by various names, is used increasingly for blouses. In spite of everything that has been predicted, the slip-over blouse with a peplum, is still the smartest vogue. To be sure, some of the very smart new blouses reach only to the waistline, but the peplum is the rule. And it is in these blouses that jersey in silk weaves is especially desirable. For it has body enough and at the same time suppleness enough to hang well around the hips. It is often elaborately embroidered, sometimes heavily braided in soutache, sometimes worked in machine stitchery with colored wool in a way that adds distinction to many of the new blouses.

Plain Pastry
This recipe is for one large pie with top and bottom crust
1 cup flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup shortening
2 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder
1/4 cup shortening
cold water
Sift together flour, salt and baking powder; add shortening and rub in very lightly with tips of fingers (the less it is handled the better the paste will be). Add cold water very slowly, enough to hold dough together (do not work or knead dough). Divide in halves; roll out one part thin on floured board and use for bottom crust. After pie is filled roll out other part for top.

Rich Pastry
2 cups pastry flour
1/2 teaspoon Royal Baking Powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup shortening
cold water
Sift flour, baking powder and salt; add one-half shortening

Divide in halves; roll out one half thin; put on in paper with the remaining shortening; fold upper and lower edges in to center; fold sides in to center, fold sides to center again; roll out thin and put on pie plate. Repeat with other half for top crust.

Apple Pie

1/2 cups flour
1/2 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup shortening
4 apples, or 1 quart sliced apples
2 tablespoons sugar
1 teaspoon milk
Sift flour, baking powder and salt; add shortening and rub in very lightly; add just enough cold water to hold dough together. Roll half out on floured board, line bottom of pie plate; fill in upper with the apples; wash, pare and cut into thin slices; sprinkle with sugar; flavor with cinnamon or nutmeg; wet edges of crust with cold water; roll out remainder of pastry; cover pie, pressing edges tightly together and bake in moderate oven 30 minutes.
