

national 500-mile race for a purse of \$50,000 is scheduled to be run Monday, May 31st.

This year's Indianapolis race, even more than preceding contests, will be a battle of brains as well as driving skill. The foremost designers and engineers of half a dozen nations will endeavor to prove the supremacy of their respective countries in the field of automotive progress.

The speedway's new racing rules call for, cars of a totally different type from those of years past, cars that are smaller and lighter in weight, with engines of almost half the size. A new inspiration has thus been provided for creative genius, an inspiration out of which is certain to come much that will be found enduringly of value.

This is the true greatness of the Indianapolis race, the distinguishing feature that sets it apart from all other contests. Truly international in scope, and with a scientific importance that is on a par with its unique standing in the world of sports, it yields its influence that is felt in the far corners of the earth, and its results are the foundation of world progress.



"It was a fine big dishpan," said the Major the other day, as she reminisced about her work of thirty years ago.


**ITALY RETURNS TO RACING
WITH WAGNER AT THE HELM**

TURIN, Italy.—The return of Italian competition in the world's championship contests on the Indianapolis speedway, and the participation of a team wearing the colors of the Adriatic nation in the next Hopsier International, is heralded by the signing of Louis Wagner, the grand old man of European racing, to lead an Italian Fiat into the fray.

Fiat teams, once triumphant in the automobile arena, both in the United States and abroad, in the days when Lancia, Wagner and Nazarro carried their gonfalon to victory, have not figured in racing since 1912, when the late David Bruce-Brown and Ralph DePalma were drafted from America to carry their colors in the Grand Prix de France. Both of the American drivers made a sensational showing in that event, Bruce-Brown winning on the basis of actual elapsed time but being deprived of
