Niccum, the bartender for Bough, who should have been one of the strongest witnesses for the state testified that he could not absolutely identify the two that invaded the place two weeks ago and held up the proprietor. Frank Bough still suffers from the gun shot that he received in the shooting.

The Sixth precinct is bounded on the east by Broadway, on the west by Main street in Tolleston, on the north by the Wabash railroad and on the south by Nineteenth avenue, and the polling place is in Muller's real estate office, on the west side of Broadway, between Thirteenth and Fourteenth avenues.

The Seventh precinct is all that territory lying east of Broadway and south of the Wabash railroad and extending south to the Little Calumet river; also all that territory lying west of Broadway and south of Nineteenth avenue and extending west to Main street in Tolleston and south to the Little Calumet river, and the polling place is in the Gordon building, corner of Twenty-first avenue and Broadway.
