## SKYSCRAPER FOR GARY'S BROADWAY

Seven-Story Bank-Office-Hotel Building to Be Erected By Chesterton Bankers.

Gary is to have a seven-story skyscraper, to be erected on the east side of Broadway, between Fifth and Sixth avenues. It will be devoted to business and office purposes for the first three floors, while the upper four floors will be used as a hotel. There will also be a roof garden.

#### To Start Soon

The seven-story structure will be erected by Jeffrey & Morgan, bankers, of Chesterton, and owners of the Security Block, Sixth avenue and Broadway. This banking firm is also interested in the new Union Trust & Savings bank.

Plans call for a modern structure.

In the first floor, which will have 30,000 feet of frontage, will be four store rooms and an arcade entrance. In the rear of the first floor arcade will be the Union bank's home. Second and third floors will be used for offices, and the upper floors for a hotel. It is said that a hotel firm has already negotiated for the hotel lease.

#### First High Building

Originally William Wirt, the educator and banker, and his brother, Chester Wirt, owners of the General Building Company, which owns the Victoria hotel structure, planned to erect a seven-story annex to the building, but the cost of materials deterred them from acting this year. There are rumors that an outside firm will build a twelve-story building in Broadway.

Parents of Married Men to Care for Their Wives, if Able, Dependency Being Barred as Exemption Excuse in Such Cases.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 9.—New exemption rulings are as follows:

Message to Governors.

The telegram to the governors follows:

"Under presidential regulations the term 'dependent for support' has given rise to several further questions of principle affecting large numbers of persons."

The general basis for ruling upon such questions should be the spirit and purpose of the act in providing for such discharge, whenever the terms of the act and of the regulations are not in themselves conclusive. The act authorizes the president to discharge wherever the parties drafted into a status with respect to persons dependent upon them for support which renders their exclusion or discharge advisable."

"Such dependency ordinarily makes discharge advisable, because since the drafted person loses his civil income and thus loses his means of support, he is left without support and thus in a position to affect the object which the draft aims to accomplish. For the same reason the only thing he can shoot at once is 'the bullet' and not 'the bow'."
