MURDERED MAN'S FAMILY TELLS OF MEXICAN CRUELTY

Mrs. John Correll, wife of the American citizen slain by Mexicans near Tampico recently, and their sixteen-year-old son, recently arrived in Washington to tell President Wilson personally of the attack upon her husband, herself and the boy and the cruelties practiced by the Mexicans in their raids and attacks on U. S. citizens. Washington asked Carranza to state his position regarding the Correll murder. Carranza has replied that he will "omit no efforts in the prosecution and punishment of these responsible for a crime so odious."

VOICE OF THE PEOPLE

Editor Times: It is quite plain to an observer that Mr. A. Wickey is quite an active propagandist in the movement to crystallize public opinion with regard to America's part in the proposed League of Nations, against the league. While I do not sympathize with his view of the case I do approve entirely of his education of the matter and hope the arguments for and against will be fully brought forth all over the land.

However, I have no intention at this time to lock horns with the gentleman over a discussion of such weighty matters. Rather would I call his attention to smaller affairs where it is felt within his power and jurisdiction, if I am not misinformed, to do much good, more perhaps, than by trying to sweep back the ocean with a broom or to regulate America's conduct in world affairs.

As the owner has provided no sidewalk the pedestrian must watch his step and be prepared to straddle the imitation Panama's, especially upon wash days. The pavement also ends abruptly at the beginning of the "Row" but in spite of the porosity of the soil there is always "the makings" of pig wallows in the street.

The city of East Chicago is much to blame for this menace to its health. The folks living there are human and are entitled to better conditions. I do not know who owns these houses but I was informed by very good authority that he answers to the name of A. Wickey.
