**MAY DEFER
BUILDING OF
NEW HOSPITAL**

On account of the prevailing high cost of building material, the proposed Methodist Episcopal hospital may not be erected until some future time, it was announced today in Gary.

In going over the bids that were submitted Tuesday evening members of the local committee found that the total runs far in excess of expectations. It was originally thought that the building could be erected for approximately \$250,000 but the bids reached the \$325,000 mark.

Yesterday the bids were sent to the state hospital board of the Methodist church for consideration and just what action is taken by that board depends upon the future of the building. The state board has agreed to furnish loans amounting to one-half of the total cost if Gary raised \$100,000. Of this amount there is about \$50,000 in the local fund.

As soon as the building is ready for erection, the Gary Land company will furnish a site at corner of Grant and Sixth avenue. Whether the local committee will re-advertise for bids or whether the project will be abandoned until the future, will probably be made

public as soon as word is received from the state board.

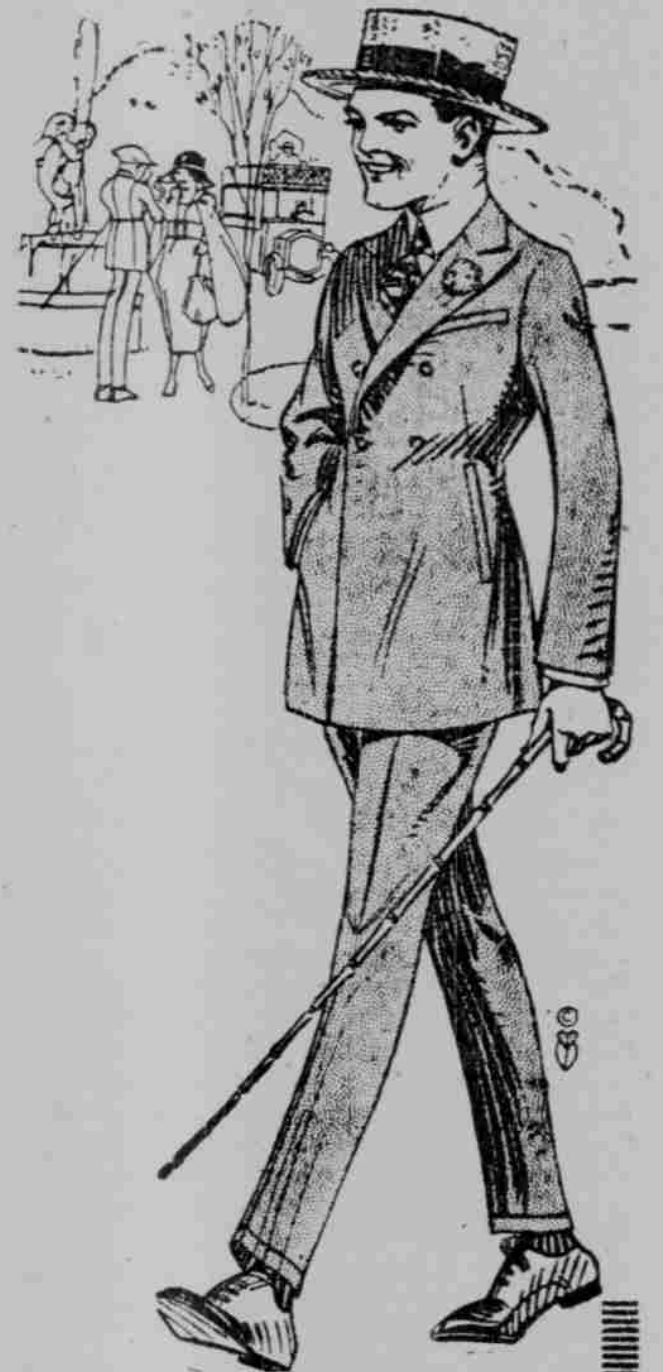

**COUNTY FOOD
DIRECTOR IS STILL
ON CAMPING TRIP.**

Urgent demands for immediate food distribution and price regulations in food, may necessitate the shortening of the two week's fishing trip of R. G. Parry of the Gary Land Company, who has received word from Dr. Harry S. Barnard, federal food administrator, of Indiana, requesting him to take charge of the county food administration

which he held during the war. In company with Pontius Heintz, Mr. Parry left a week ago Wednesday to spend a two weeks fishing trip in the wilds north of Tower, Minn. Dr. Barnard sent a communication to him, asking that he re-assume charge of the county food situation, to reorganize his county food machine and put his former deputies back on their old war jobs. Whether Mr. Parry will accept the offer and what his future plans will be will not be made known until his return. He is expected back the first of next week.

TO SHIP ICE TO GARY

In an effort to cut down the high price of ice in Gary, Fred H. Detrich, chairman of the ice investigating committee announced today that ice is to be purchased from cities outside of the state, to be shipped here in carload lots and sold at cost figures.

In the investigation it was discovered that the state association of ice dealers are responsible for exorbitant ice prices in this city and cities

where there is no competition, are paying like prices. In Indianapolis where there are competitive plants, the consumer is paying only 45 cents a hundred, while in Gary it has not only reached the dollar mark, but the peddlers are charging and getting anything they want because of the prevailing ice shortage. Prices on carload lots are being secured.
