
## SUPERHEATERS AT MORRIS PARK

## Sport Snap Shots

The largest rifle tournament ever attempted in any country is to be held at Caldwell, N. J., this summer.

A force of 700 bluejackets and marines are working night and day to complete the new 150 target butts, which when finished will make the largest rifle range in the world. The construction of barracks and mess halls has been begun to accommodate the thousands of riflemen and officers expected to arrive during the next six weeks.

In addition to the time honored Wimbledon and Leech cup matches several innovations have been planned. A small boat match with England, the entry of Canadian, Italian, French and Belgian teams and the return of the victorious A. E.
