

SHIP SALE SCORED IN U. S. SENATE

Senator Ashurst Wants the
Sale Prohibited Next
Monday.

(INTERNATIONAL NEWS SERVICE)
WASHINGTON, Feb. 12.—The proposed sale of ships, formerly German-owned, by the shipping board was denounced today by Senator Ashurst, Democrat, of Arizona. He introduced a resolution prohibiting their sale as planned for next Monday.

Prohibition and inability of the government to maintain liquor laws at government-owned and operated ships was a reason advanced for the sale of the ships in a letter addressed today by John Barton Payne of the Shipping Board to Senator Ashurst and Rep. James M. Reed of New York.

Payne claimed that these ships could never be disposed of to better advantage than at the present time. A condition of the sale, he contended, is that the ships shall remain under the American flag and be sailed in accordance with the board.

"These vessels are to be sold for \$15,000,000," he said.

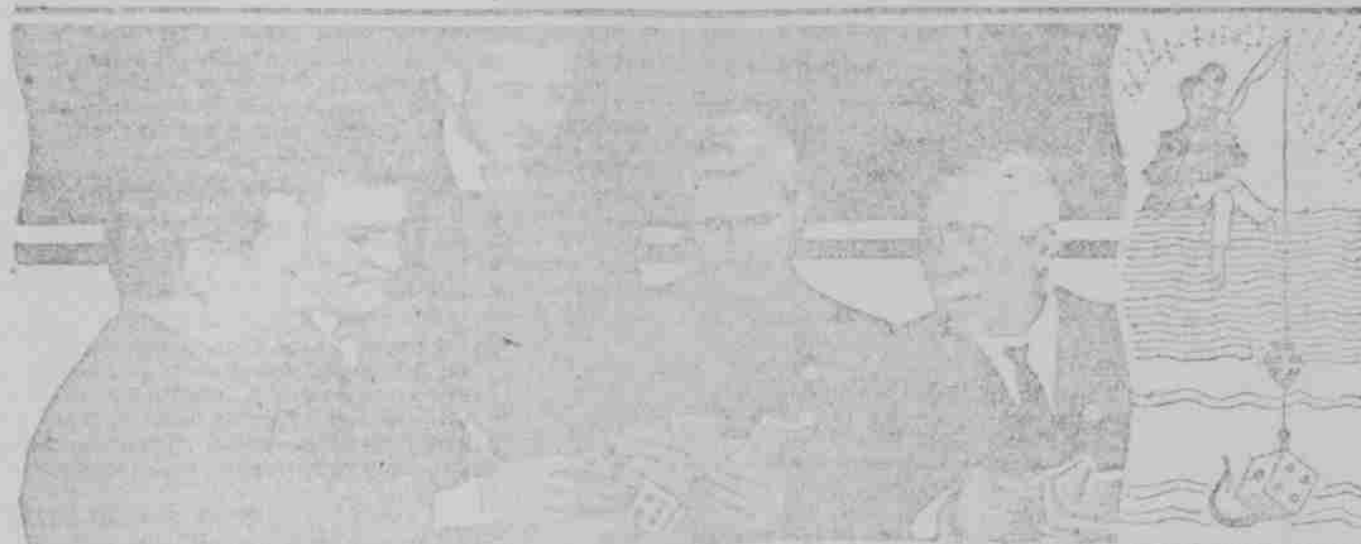
