SHALL WOMEN POWDER THEIR FACES?

If you are a young girl, youth is surely the prettiest adornment of a face and I would advise you, not to use powder frequently.

first aids to good complexion and looks.

MILK.

At this time when we hear all complaints about the high price of milk, many people feel they want to cut this very important food out altogether, not realizing how nutritious milk is as a food.

In addition to water, milk contains the five necessary materials for bodily health, growth and energy. It contains protein, the tissue builder; carbohydrate and fat, the energy and fuel foodstuffs; mineral salts, the body regulators and bone builders, and vitamins, without which the child cannot grow and be healthy. Vitamins are also found to a lesser extent in the green leaves and seeds of plants and in other animal fats, and in the yolk of eggs, but are especially abundant in butter and fat. All of the nutritious substances of milk are in the most highly assimilative form.

When we seek some escape from the high prices which surround us, we find that there is none, so we must buy such foods as will give us the greatest amount of nutriment for the money expended, and when we compare the cost of milk with whole cereals or bread, with that of meat and bread, we find that measured by the standard of benefit derived, milk and cereals or milk and bread are much cheaper forms of nutriment than meat and bread. This is true both as to children and adults.
