

NEW ANGLE TO MURDER MYSTERY

Investigation by the Indiana Harbor police of the murder of George F. Funderburk by an unidentified Negro Sunday afternoon has disclosed an account of the trouble which conflicts with that given by the doctor by the injured man before he lost consciousness.

A Mexican who was in the restaurant at the time of the trouble, but who is unable to give a good description of the Negro, asserts that the trouble arose over a meal ticket and that in the course of the argument the Negro picked up a kitchen knife and used it as a weapon, striking Funderburk on the head with it. The police are at a loss to explain why Funderburk should have told the doctor that he had drawn the color line if the story of the Mexican is true. The police, however, are prone to believe the Mexican's version of the struggle rather than that told to the doctor by Funderburk.

The police are also investigating another circumstance which may or may not have a bearing on the case. Funderburk was believed to have a knowledge of the whereabouts of George Moore, a Negro wanted by the Chicago police for murder. Moore formerly lived in the rooms over the restaurant and the Indiana Harbor police believed Funderburk knew where Moore was hiding, although examination failed to elicit any information.

Moore, while working in a Chicago night restaurant, killed the night chef by hitting him in the back of the neck

TREATY SITUATION IN THE DOLDRUMS

Negotiations Suspended Until Boundary Draft is Decided By Premiers.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.—The treaty situation in the senate today was apparently at a hopeless standstill.

In the face of reports that President Wilson may find it necessary to withdraw the treaty because of the action of the council of premiers in drafting boundary proposals to which this nation would be bound without consultation, all negotiations were in suspension. Some leaders declared that if the president did not withdraw the treaty that it was very likely that steps would be taken by the senate itself to lay the treaty aside unless there were definite promises of some action.

During the two days that the treaty had been before the senate this week there has been only one debate which centered around a general discussion of the qualities and faults of the treaty and there has been no movement whatever that indicated that any compromise on the most Article X was in sight.

TRIES TO BRIBE TAX COLLECTOR

Millionaire Chicagoan as a Result Finds Himself In Jail.

CHICAGO, Feb. 18.—After spending a night in jail on a charge of bribing a \$10,000 bribe to a central income tax collector, Albert C. Lauer, secretary and treasurer of Briggs and Turley, a million dollar iron salvaging corporation, returned his efforts to obtain his freedom today. Lauer's arrest was caused by Charles E. Lauer, the collector, who appears at income tax collecting headquarters with a roll of bills of large denomination, totaling \$10,000 which he charged Lauer paid him so that the iron salvaging income schedule might pass unquestioned.

OFFICIALS PLAN NEW BOULEVARD

After traveling through Gary to Miller beach, which will probably be one of the busiest waterfront spots on the lake this summer, are practically assured the use of a new 100 foot boulevard from Gary to the beach. It is to be built from the old city limits to E. Fifth ave. to the water's edge.

The road, which will be built by the town of Miller, will cost in the neighborhood of \$225,000. Realizing that the new project will be as much benefit to the city as to the residents of Gary, leading business men of Robert are working in conjunction.

In furthering the plans for the construction of the new road, Mayor Hodges mentioned this morning that steps are being taken today to disannex some land in order that the project may be put through.

The meeting will endeavor to bring out the purposes of Americanization and will explain the plans of the promoters for the work in the Twin Cities. The special purpose of the meeting will be to bring out the point that "an American is a man who feels American, thinks American and acts American no matter where he was born."
