

E. CHICAGO IS AROUSED O'ER CENSUS

Special Election Will Be Held to Get Into Second Class City List Because of Enumeration.

A special election to determine whether or not East Chicago should become a city of the second class regardless of the census enumeration, which is now being taken, seems almost a certainty as far as public opinion can be determined.

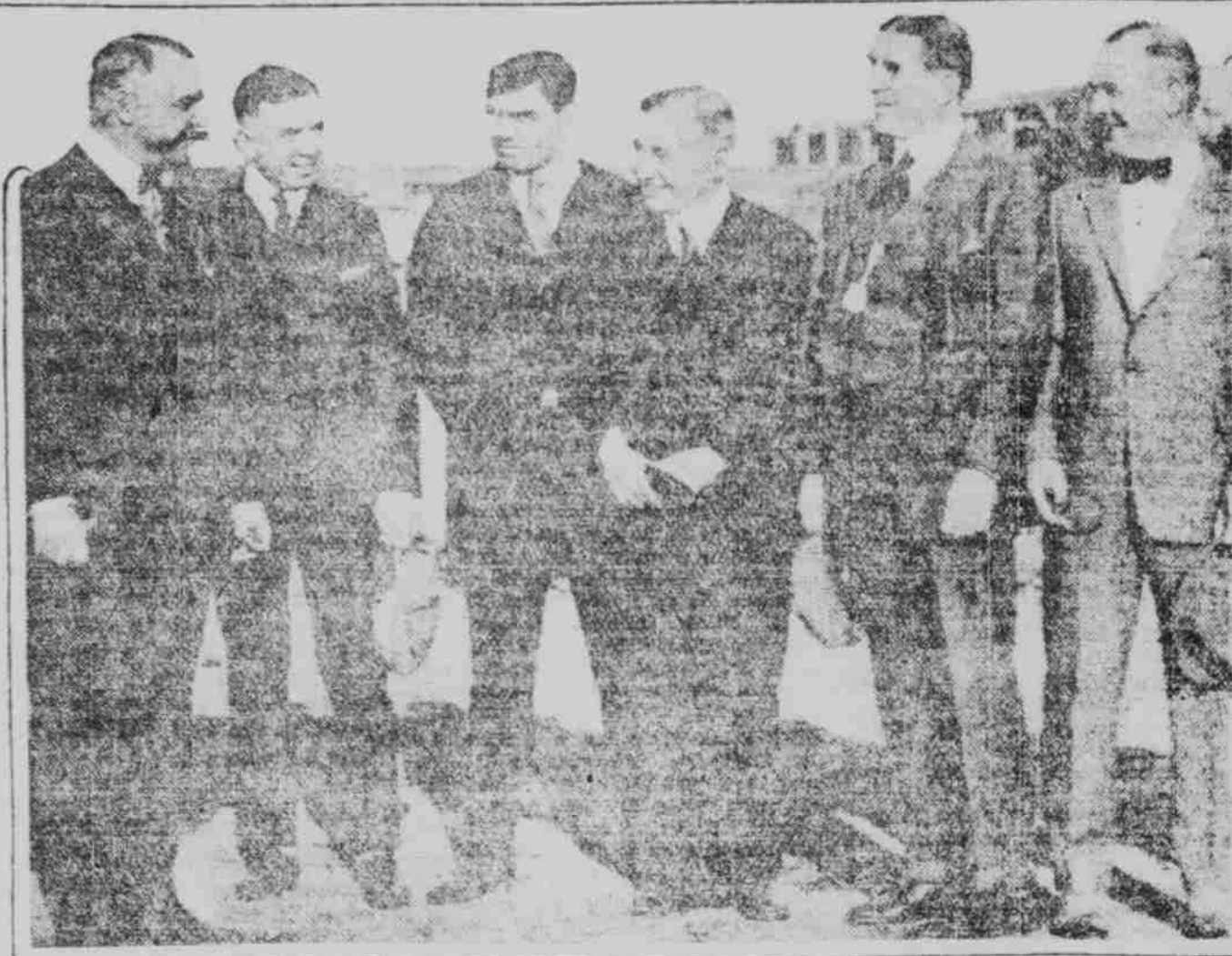
At the meeting of the East Chicago Chamber of Commerce yesterday noon, Walter Mybeck, census inspector for East Chicago, reported that he estimated the population of East Chicago would not be more than 24,000. This met with a storm of disapproval and some doubt as to the accuracy of the enumeration, but Mr. Mybeck explained that instead of increasing the population of the city had decreased since last summer. Records available show that almost 2,000 people have left the city for the old country over the Pennsylvania and New York Central lines from Indiana Harbor alone since last September and it is supposed that a large number of the city's foreigners returned to the old
