

WHITING HAS CANDIDATE FOR REPRESENTATIVE

Oscar A. Ahlgren's Friends Believe Him Well Qualified for Assembly.

WHITING, Ind., March 12.—Oscar A. Ahlgren, of Whitings, is a candidate for the office of Representative of Lake county in the general assembly on the Republican ticket.



Mr. Ahlgren is entering the field upon the persuasion of Whiting business men, Hammond, Gary and East Chicago friends. In fact his business friends in this community have a strong representative. Mr. Ahlgren is one of the best known young men in this region, being the son of Mr. and Mrs. John Ahlgren, and was born in Chicago on August 26, 1891. He came to Whiting when very young, graduating from the Whiting high school in 1911. In high school he gave evidence of his oratorical ability, having won the Lake county oratorical contest for two successive years. Following the completion of his high school course the young man having secured a scholarship entered DePaul college at Detroit, Wis., where he graduated in 1915. Here he not only won the DePaul college oratorical contest, but the International oratorical contest as well. After graduation at DePaul, Mr. Ahlgren spent the next year teaching public speaking in the East Chicago high school following which he entered Yale at New Haven, Conn., where he took up the study of law. It was while a student here that ex-President William Howard Taft saw his instructor in constitutional law, and from

him he had the true principles of republicanism impressed upon him. For these years he attended the university, finishing his studies which he had made great sacrifices to pursue for when he considered a law graduate's education his own personal welfare, the country's call. He cultivated in the branch of aerial photography which he soon qualified as an instructor, expecting to go westward just as the summer was signed. Upon his discharge from service Mr. Ahlgren returned to Whiting where he was taken into the office of Judge John H. Peterson, where he is rapidly acquiring himself as a successful attorney. This young man does not consider himself a Whiting alone, but in also in the service and welfare of this region in which he is deeply interested and keeps well posted on the affairs of the county.
