SUFFRAGE LEADERS ARE OPTIMISTIC

WASHINGTON, March 31.—Suffrage leaders here today took new hope and expressed "optimism" over the situation in Delaware where the state legislature is meeting to act upon ratification of the suffrage amendment.

Miss Alice Paul, leader of the National Woman's Party, in a telephone message from Dover, Delaware, declared:

"A great accession of strength during the recess of the legislature makes us feel that the outlook is now brighter."

It was announced here that the governor of Vermont has agreed to call a special session of the legislature of that state if the attorney-general instructs him as to the constitutionality of such a step.

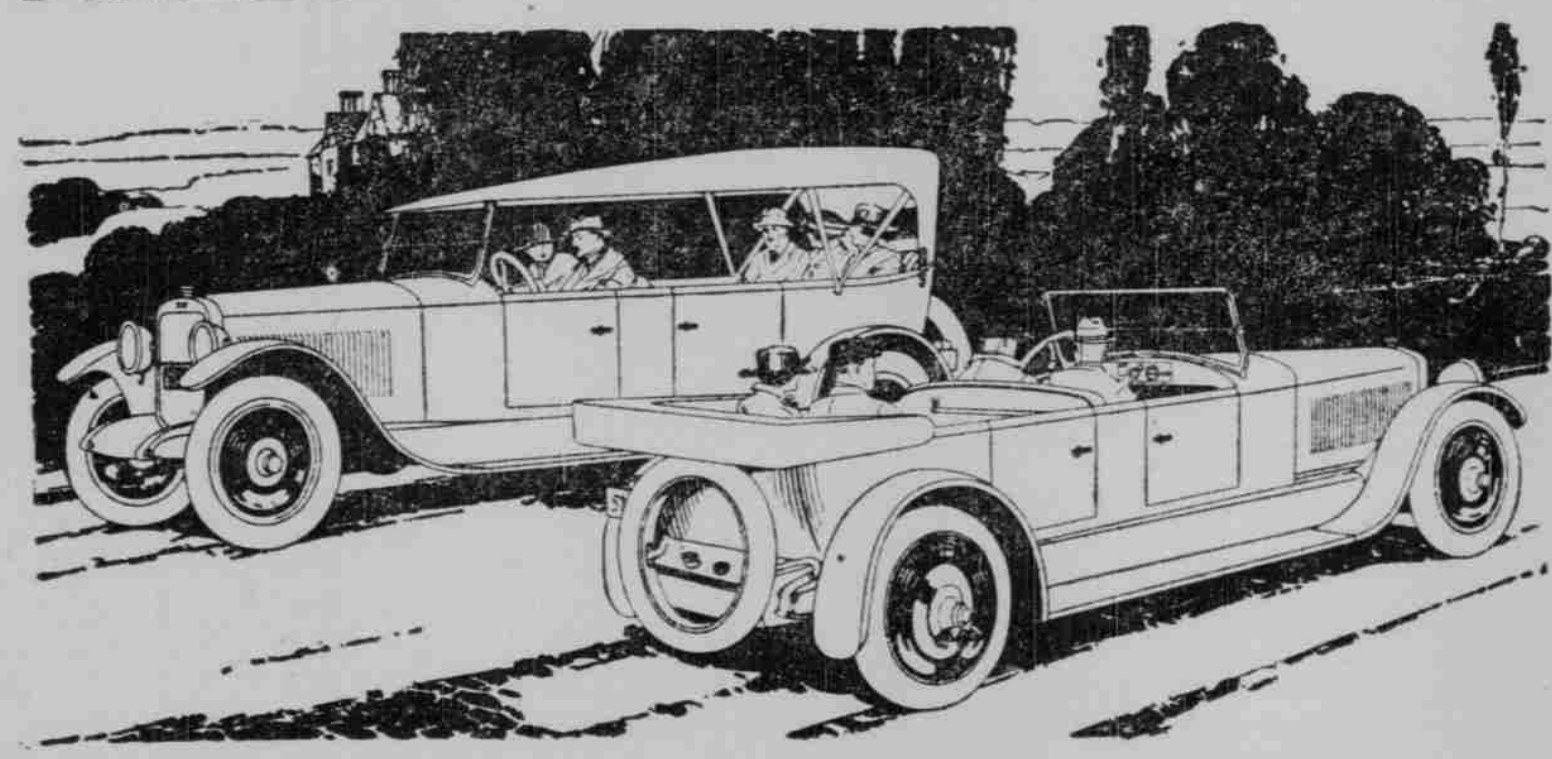
