

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:
Notice is hereby given by the Board of Public Works of the City of East Chicago, Lake County, Indiana, that on the 12th day of April, 1920, they have adopted a Resolution for the vacation of that part of 141st street, in said City, County and State, from the easterly line of Alder street to the westerly line of Olive avenue, more specifically described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a point thirty-three (33) feet east of the north and south center line of Section twenty-two (22), Township thirty-seven (37) North, Range nine (9) West of the Second Principal Meridian, Lake County, Indiana, and forty (40) feet north of the south line of said Section twenty-two (22), the same being the northwesterly corner of Alder street and 141st street; thence easterly on a line forty (40) feet north of and parallel to the south line of said Section twenty-two (22), a distance of two thousand five hundred fifty (2550) feet to the westerly line of Olive avenue; thence southerly along the westerly line of

THIS is the farmer's merry-go-round.

The clever farmer who knows how to conduct his business, will borrow all the money he can at a low rate of interest in order to carry out this cycle.

The Federal Land bank is furnishing money to businesslike farmers who already have a bankable credit and it is said that a very large proportion of the loans so made are to buy more land to raise more corn to feed more hogs, etc.

And as such, there will be no complaint except that the farm tenant and hired man or the beginner has very little opportunity to borrow money from that source to buy land on the same basis.

Objections are made to one feature of this excellent law because the bonds are exempt from taxation. At this time of year, when farmers are figuring out the income tax which they are required to pay on the in-

come received from their land and livestock, it is a good thing to think about the complete exemption that is granted to wealthy owners of Federal Land Bank bonds and Joint Stock Land Bank bonds. The taxes that the rich men evade, by buying tax-exempt bonds of any kind, are simply added to the taxes paid by farmers and others whose incomes are not exempt.

The Federal Farm Loan Act was enacted to help the business of agriculture. Like all other laws, it might be improved. It is not fair that very wealthy men should be exempted from taxation when farmers, who are paying interest on the funds which they have furnished, are obliged to pay the property taxes and also income taxes.

It is only within the last three or four years that the policy of tax exemption has become a practical matter of great importance to every one. The enormous national debt which the war placed upon our nation must be paid, and tax exemption is furnishing a means of escape for the wealthy men with large annual income. Something must be done to make up the shortage in tax revenue. There are only two ways to escape it—either the rich men must be made to pay their share of the heavy tax burden or small property owners and land owners must have their taxes increased.

That part of Butternut street, in said City, County and State, from the southerly line of 140th street to the northerly line of 141st street, more specifically described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the easterly line of Butternut street and the southerly line of 140th street; thence southerly along the easterly line of Butternut street, a distance of five hundred eighty-nine (589) feet to the northerly line of 141st street; thence westerly along the northerly line of 141st street, a distance of sixty-six (66) feet to the westerly line of Butternut street; thence northerly along the westerly line of Butternut street, a distance of five hundred eighty-nine (589) feet to the southerly line of 140th street; thence easterly along the southerly line of 140th street, a distance of sixty-six (66) feet to the place of beginning; also,

That part of Catalpa street, in said City, County and State, from the southerly line of 140th street to the northerly line of 141st street, more specifically described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the southerly line of 140th street and the easterly line of Catalpa street; thence southerly along the easterly line of Catalpa street, a distance of five hundred eighty-nine (589) feet to the northerly line of 141st street; thence westerly along the northerly line of 141st street, a distance of sixty-six (66) feet to the westerly line of Catalpa street; thence northerly along the westerly line of Catalpa street, a distance of five hundred eighty-nine (589) feet to the southerly line of 140th street; thence easterly along the southerly line of 140th street, a distance of sixty-six (66) feet to the place of beginning; also,

That part of Deal street, in said City, County and State, from the southerly line of 140th street to the northerly line of 141st street, more specifically described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the southerly line of 140th street and the easterly line of Deal street;
