KEWANEE, Ill., April 15.—This overgrown factory town of 29,000 persons, after a restless night following twelve hours of rioting and industrial anarchy, produced by a strike of the employees of the Walworth Manufacturing Co., awoke today to find khaki-clad militiamen on every corner. The state troops, it was reported, "have the situation well in hand."

The soldiers were ordered to Kewanee after a carnival of rioting had occurred in which many of the workers who remained at the plant had been slashed and shot at and their families driven from their homes.
