(INTERNATIONAL NEWS SERVICE) KEWANEE, ILL., April 15.—This overgrown factory town of 20,000 persons, after a restless night following twelve hours of rioting and industrial anarchy produced by a strike of the employees of the Walworth Manufacturing Co., awoke today to find khaki-clad militiamen on every corner. The state troops, it was reported, "have the situation well in hand."


