STRIKE IN KANSAS CITY DEAD ISSUE

KANSAS CITY, MO., April 16.—The
"outlaw" strike of Kansas City switch
men apparently was a dead issue to-
day.

With their ranks weakened by de-
fections and facing expulsion from the
Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen un-
less they return to work tomorrow,
practically nothing remained for the
"rebels" today but to "toss up the
sponge."

Seventy-five per cent of the "outlaws"
are expected to "be back on the job"
by nightfall with freight traffic prac-
tically normal by tomorrow.

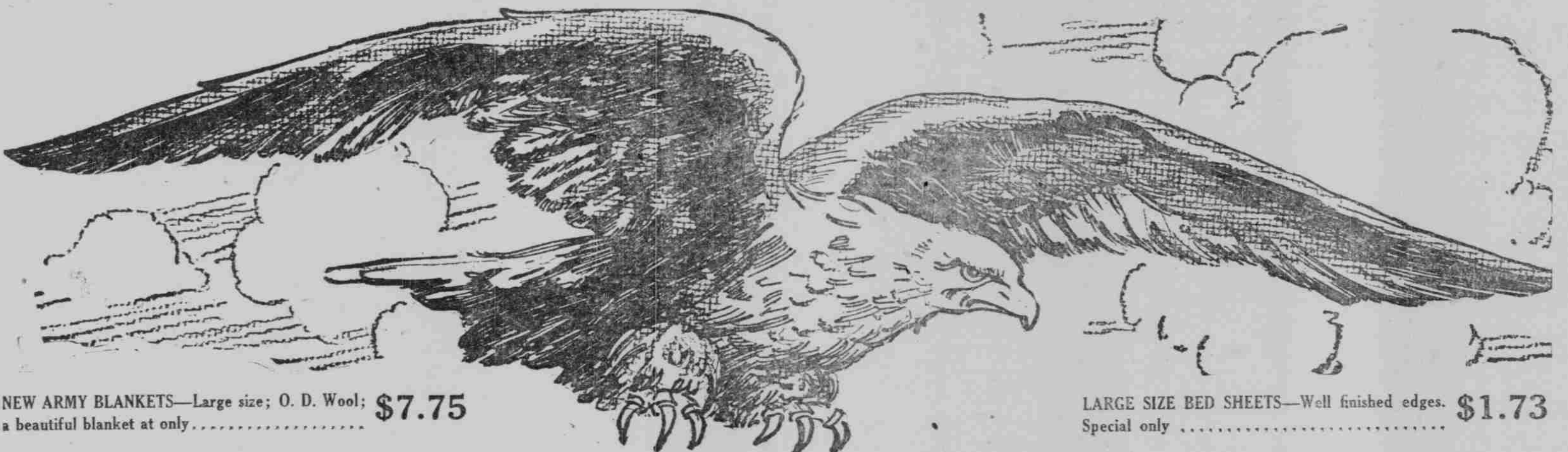
