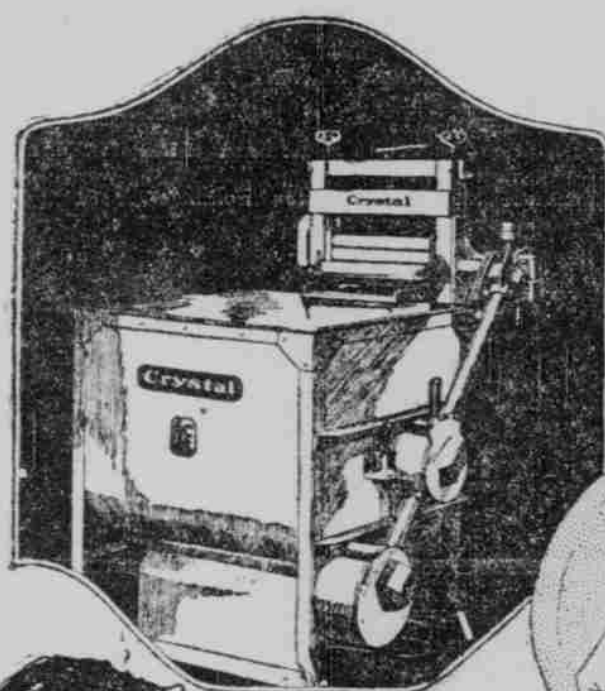

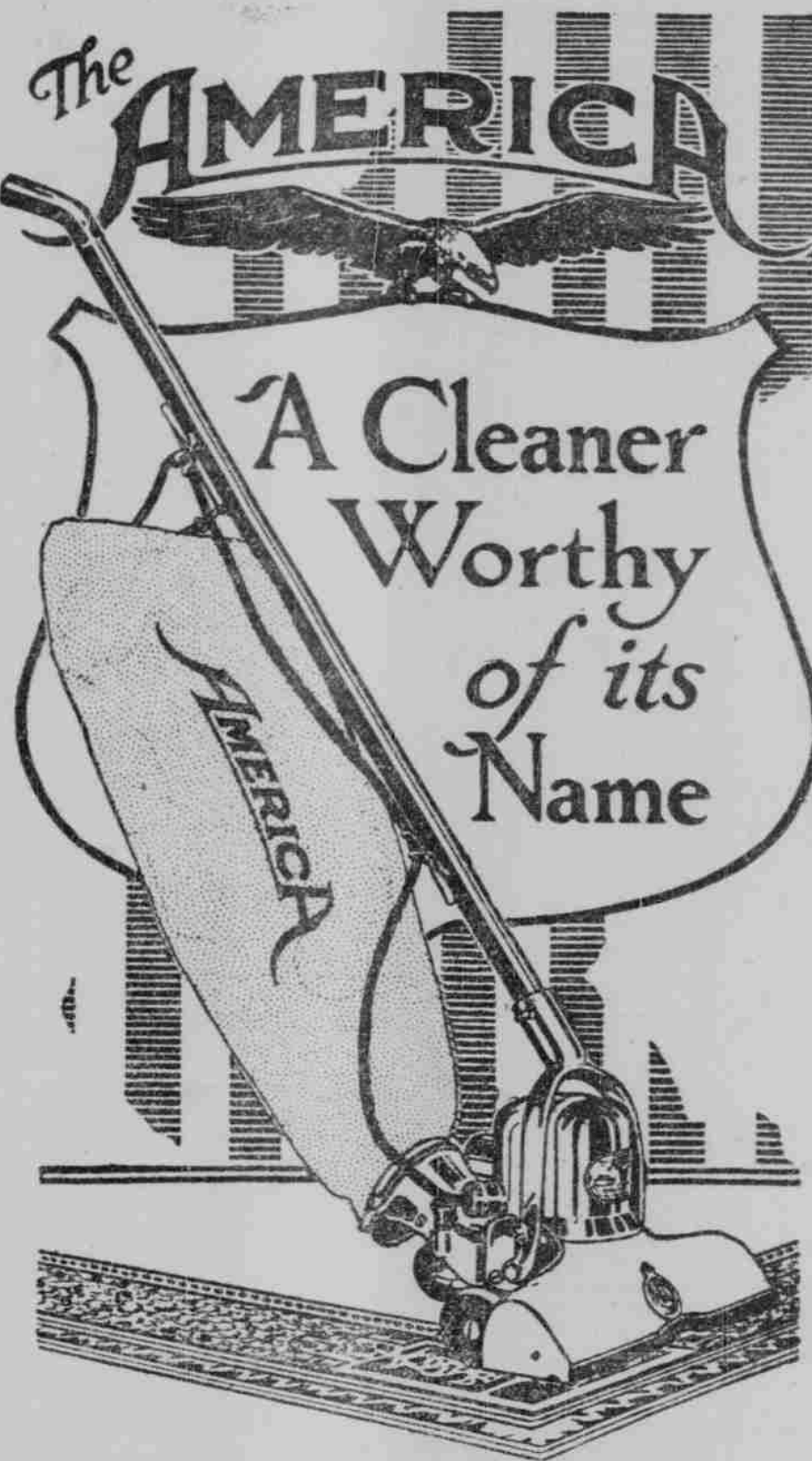
Sealing Wax in the Middle Ages.

Ancient Mill, With Coolie Engineer, Grinds Food Supply While Boys Study—Women Sometimes Take Donkey's Place.

In the courtyard of a Chinese school this intelligent looking coolie with the Pollyanna expression is the assistant to the donkey which is grinding rice to make flour for the school children.

In Chinese homes, where rice flour is essential at festival times, women take the position of the donkey here pictured. In a few port cities there are flour mills, and occasionally, in flour shops and mills, donkeys and water buffaloes are used as power.

Understanding the customs of China and leading the people into some knowledge of sanitation and speedier

methods is the first function of American missionaries in the Orient, according to the Interchurch World Movement. This organization, a co-operation of the Protestant Churches of the United States, has discovered in its recent surveys many illuminating avenues of approach to the Chinese mind.

The first interest in the missionaries, often despised as "immigrants" in the beginning of their service, comes frequently through a bit of random knowledge of machinery or suggestions as to labor saving devices.
