WASHINGTON, April 20.—A nationwide round-up of profiteers within the next thirty days is planned by the Department of Justice.

Howard Figg, special assistant to the Attorney General, made this announcement today before the subcommittee investigating high prices. He qualified the statement, however, by saying:

"Evidence being gathered by the flying squadrons points to action by that time."

"The prosecutions will cover food, fuel and clothing industries and dealers," Figg added.

### MAY COMMANDER OIL FOR THE NAVY
