## PEACE IS RESTORED IN THE RUHR TRACT

DUSSELDORF, April 19 (via Paris, April 20).—Peace has been restored in the Ruhr district, but only by force of arms. Most of the workmen, members of the former Red army, have returned to the mines and factories, but "action committees" are functioning. They are still maintaining an organization and declare that the workmen will be called to arms again if the reichswehr break the government agreement and advance through the Heiberfeld-Barmen-Hagen district.

Most of the workers are bitter against the Berlin government, which they call reactionary. Some of them declare that they would prefer Bolshevism, although they personally disclaim being Bolsheviks. Others say they would welcome intervention by the Allies in the Ruhr district. The workers accuse Gen. Hasse, commanding the Bavarian reichswehr, of organized brutality during the advance into the Ruhr zone.

### JAPS SUFFER HEAVY CASUALTIES

LONDON, April 21.—The Japanese troops in Siberia, North of Vladivostok, suffered 2,000 casualties in the fighting at Nikolai and Khabarovsk last Thursday, according to advices to the war office today. The Russian Bolshevik forces sustained heavy losses and were forced to retreat.
