


JAIL CELLS HELP SOLVE HOUSING PROBLEM

American, British and French makes of motorcycles and sidecars took part. The contestants were required to maintain a certain riding schedule and in addition to this, special tests for reliability, silence, flexibility, easy starting, etc., were used in awarding the marks.

PENNSYLVANIA STATE CONSTABULARY

The Pennsylvania state constabulary, a military organization which rivals that of the famous Canadian Northwest Mounted Police, will henceforth use motorcycles in patrolling the state highways and running down motor thieves and other law violators. The unit sign was hung on Old Dobbin when a contract was recently awarded one of the leading motorcycle manufacturers for seventy of the latest model motorcycles. All of the mounted men will take a thorough course of training in the operation and maintenance of motorcycles at the factory school.

INTREPID RIDER BRAVES DEATH VALLEY.

An achievement that is unequalled in motoring history was performed this month by John E. Hogg of Los Angeles, when in the interests of three large rail-

road companies he made a tour of Death Valley on a middleweight machine. The trip, which is a hazardous one at any time of the year, because of the utter absence of distinguishable trails, the great distance between water holes, and prancing packs of coyotes was accomplished by Hogg and his little machine without a single mishap. He covered over 800 miles on the floor of Death Valley itself, which is the greatest depression on the face of the earth with the exception of the Deep Sea region in Palestine.
