WHITING H. TO HAVE A BALL TEAM

(SPECIAL TO THE TIMES) — For the first time in the history of athletics at the Whiting high school, a representative baseball team will take part in the inter-scholastic sports of the school.

Coach Hart is considerably enthused over the large number of candidates who have reported for practice. The reputation long held by W. H. Hatfield was one of the most promising men on the team and the announcement of his ineligibility to enter was received by members of the squad as an omen of defeat. There is hope, however, that he will be permitted to enter the county events at Crown Point, May 3.

The pole vault seems to have been cinched by Menzel Stocker.


