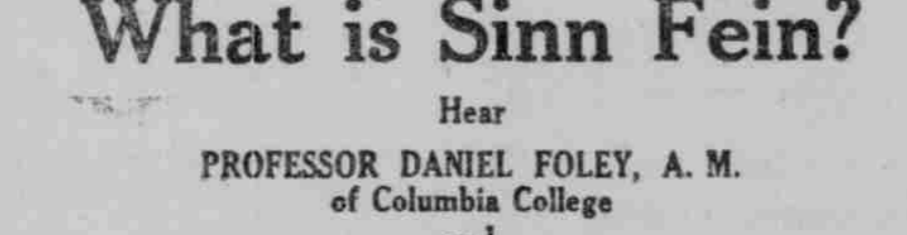

BETTER PROSPECTS FOR ADJOURNMENT

Special Session of Legislature Sure to Adjourn Tomorrow, it is Believed.

(INTERNATIONAL NEWS SERVICE)
INDIANAPOLIS, IND., July 27.—Chances for an early adjournment of the legislature were more favorable today than they have been at any time since the special session convened two weeks ago last Monday, following the release by the senate to the house of the Kiper tax cure bill by a vote of 14 to 12. The bill had been tied up in a conference committee for several days. The decision of the senate, it is believed, will tend to relieve the tension which has existed between the two bodies of the legislature for some time and restore harmony in the legislature for some time an dreasure harmony in the legislative halls. It had

been expected the senate would refuse to release the Kiper bill from committee until the house had concurred in the amendments to the Johnson home rule bill.

Prospects for adjournment since late tonight are favorable unless some thing unforeseen develops and in any event the legislature is sure to adjourn tomorrow, it is said.

According to present indications the Kiper bill will go into conference immediately after it is received in the house and it is generally believed the decisive provisions of the senate bill.
