

LITTLE PAPERS CAN OBTAIN NEWS PRINT

INDIANAPOLIS, IND., Nov. 12—Indiana newspaper publishers who are without news print contracts were assured of a plentiful supply of paper during 1921 at a conference at the governor's office today of representatives of the state republican and democratic Editorial Associations and the Northern Indiana Editorial Association, with Willard E. Carpenter, chairman of the board of directors of the Inland Press Association.

Largo dailies throughout the country will continue the allocation of news print through the editorial associations. Those papers who have no paper contracts, it was stated, and the "little fellows" were urged to remain on the spot" market after January 1. A rush of buying on the open market would result in panic and inflation of prices, it was declared. Ed. Hancock of Greenburg was named central agent for news print transaction in Indiana.


FARMERS IN DRIVE OF THEIR OWN

SPRINGFIELD, ILL., NOV. 11.—The drive for membership in the Lake County Farm Bureau and the Indiana Federation of Farmers Association is on in full swing in Lake County. This drive opened November 4th in West Creek Township. It will continue until November 28th.

Tuesday night a rousing meeting was held at Lowell and farmers at all these meetings voiced their sentiments as being strongly in favor of the organization which will protect their interests and promote the general welfare of their business.

Farmer J. Lux, who was to have been sent to this country as an organizer was unable to come and in his stead the state organization furnished M. J. Briggs, farmer of Miami county. Mr. Briggs last week completed the membership drive in LaPorte county where more than 1,700 farmers joined the Lake County Farm Bureau. Mr. Briggs holds the state wide record here in Lake

U. S. NAVY'S GIANT DIRIGIBLE HANGAR NEARING COMPLETION

To house the world's largest dirigible, now being built in England for the U. S. government, the American navy is building a giant hangar at Lakehurst, N. J. It is now about 90 per cent com-

plete and appears like a giant skeleton. It is to be completed in time to receive the "ship" when it sails across the ocean next spring. The photo shows the great doors that slide back and

forth on electrically operated railway trucks and the tall elevator tower. The hangar is 900 feet long, 349 feet wide and 207 feet high. Its estimated cost will be \$3,700,000.



FRENCH POACHED EGGS
Put three pints of boiling water in a saucepan and add one-half teaspoonful salt and one tablespoonful vinegar. Stir vigorously around and around the edge of the saucepan, while the water is boiling. As soon as a well is formed in the middle of the water, slip in an egg. Remove to back of the range and cook until the white is set. Take out with a skimmer and trim. Repeat this until the number of eggs desired are prepared.

TAHALOUE PICKLE
Three pints of vinegar, four cantaloupes, three and one-half pounds of sugar, one ounce of stick cinnamon, two tablespoonsfuls whole cloves, one ounce white ginger, one ounce celery seed, one ounce of white mustard seed, one tablespoonful of ground allspice.

Take four cantaloupes, not quite ripe. Peel and cut in small pieces and put in a weak brine for 24 hours. Pour this off and allow to stand over night in alum water, using a piece of alum the size of a large walnut in enough water to cover the fruit. In the morning pour off and let stand in clear water until the next morning. For this make a syrup of three pints of vinegar, three and one-half pounds of sugar, one ounce of stick cinnamon, one ounce of white ginger, one ounce of celery seed, one ounce of white mustard seed, one tablespoonful of ground allspice, two tablespoonsfuls of whole cloves. After boiling the melon in clear water, until tender, drain and lay in syrup and boil altogether until done.

of hatred are abounded and a reasonable and faithful co-operation of all peoples is achieved. But as yet America has not made peace with us. The efforts of the entente governments to force the complete fulfillment of the Versailles treaty makes Germany's recovery and of all Europe impossible. I do not give up faith in a better future. The general distress will force the U. S. Europe and the league of nations to act. But before then many victims will have fallen.

Georg Goethals, leader of the democratic party and former minister of the treasury.—The German monarchy was a thing of the past at the time of the signing of the armistice. The revolution and the National assembly elections brought a decided victory for democracy. This was consolidated by the constitution of Weimar. But the long drawn-out rioting of the extreme left, the strike rage, the incessant demands for higher wages by workmen and officials, the altogether unsatisfactory economic situations which caused a terrible drop in the mark and above all, the destructive peace conditions and violence of their enforcement by France and Poland have strengthened considerably the revolutionary elements. The

outcome of the Von Kapp revolution however, demonstrated that there is no ground in Germany for a restoration of the monarchy. Germany will not recover as long as the entente insists on carrying out to the letter the impossible peace conditions. They bleed us to death economically and financially. We cannot attain order in our country unless a radical revision is made

in the peace treaty according to the solemn promises given at the time of the armistice. Until then Europe's peace will be endangered.
